

- c. Halvor b. 1788, widow Berit Nilsdtr. Borgos, living at Borgos 101/3 (Flata) in Brekken.
- d. Guri b. 1796, gm Nils Halvorsen Borgos b. 1796. Lived at Borgos 99/1 in Brekken.
- e. Lisbet, gm Hans Evensen Brynhildsvoll. Lives at Brynhildsvoll 77/1 by Aursunden.

In Peder Hansen's census from 1762, in addition to Marit from Per-Hansagarden, another Marit Pedersdtr is mentioned. living on the farm, age and origin unknown. It may have been the last-named Marit who was married to an Ole Pedersen Stuedal (unknown origin). These had a son Ingebrigt b. 1770. We know nothing more about this family.

Ole and Marit

Eldest son Ole Ingebrigtsen and his wife Marit Pedersdtr. took over the building after Ingebrigt died in 1777. Their children:

1. Guri born 1761, died after 5 months.
2. Ingebrigt born 1763, died after 2 weeks.
3. Guri (1764-1834), gm Peder Torkildsen b. 1750, from Flora in Selbu (parents Anne Kristensdtr., from Nettet g.no. 116, and Torkild Pedersen Heggset). Guri and Peder are mentioned as living here in Oppgarden in the census in 1801. It can be mentioned that in 1810 Guri, who had then become a widow, received 8 dalers in a prize from the Royal Norwegian Science Society for knitting woollens. The previous year she had knitted 4 dozen and in 1810 5 dozen fabric men's hats. Guri and Peder had the children:
 - a. Anne (1786-1811). She had a son with Ole Olsen Evenmo from Haltdalen:
Ole (1809-1876), gm Kierstina Tronsdtr. Bjørgan (1815-1897) from Bjørgan 23/2 (Trongarden) in Haltdalen. They lived at Selbyggrommet in Aunegrenda in Haltdalen. (Behind the names of Anne Pedersdtr. and Ole Evenmo it is noted in the church register: "hans 3die, hendes Iste". It may have been this Ole Evenmo who for a time was a driver at Nettet g.no. 116 in Flora, Selbu.
 - b. Ole (1788-1836), gm Gidsken Hansdtr. Brendås b. 1801, from Brendåstrøa. See this one, where the children are mentioned. As a widow, Gidsken married again with Ingebrigt Olsen Aas, b. 1810, from Bøns garden. See this one, where their children are mentioned. The family emigrated to America in 1866.
 - c. Peder (1790-1842), unmarried. He was called Skjelv-Per.
