I John Wildonger of Plumstead Township in the County of Bucks and State of Pennsylvania, being of sound mind, memory and understanding do make and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking and making void all former wills by me heretofore made.

Imprimis, I direct my Executor to procure common tomb-stones for me, and <sup>for</sup> for the same out of money belonging to my estate.

Item, whatever balance remains after paying my funeral expenses, tomb-stones and other debts which I may have, I give and bequeath to the use and occupancy of the same whether personal property or real estate to my son John F. Wildonger, and if he should die before his wife Mary Jane Wildonger, then and in that case I give and bequeath the use and occupancy of my personal property and real estate to the said Mary Jane Wildonger and after her decease of both my son John F. Wildonger and his wife Mary Jane Wildonger, I direct that the balance of my estate whatever it may be, shall be equally divided among and between, the children of my said son John F. Wildonger or their heirs share and share alike.

I direct my Executor hereinafter named to sell enough of my personal property to pay my debts and expenses, and a reasonable fee or compensation for him my said Executor unless my son John F. Wildonger shall raise him enough money to pay said debts and expenses, by debts I do not intend to include the principle of the Mortgage I owe on my real estate but direct that my son John F. Wildonger or the person occupying my said real estate shall pay the interest on said Mortgage. But if my son John F. Wildonger shall


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at any time give notice to my executor that he no longer desires to occupy said real estate and pay the interest and taxes, and keep it in repair, then my executor may sell my said farm at public sale, paying off said Mortgage and investing the balance in his hands in good real estate security, and annually paying the interest on said balance to my said son John F. Wildonger or to his wife, Mary Jane Wildonger if she live longer than my said son John F. Wildonger.

And in case it is thus arranged to sell my said real estate, which is situated in Plumstead Township, in the aforesaid County of Bucks, I hereby authorize my executor, to make a good and lawful deed for the conveyance of all of my real estate, and in the management of my estate authorize him to sell and buy cattle and horses to be kept on my said real estate.

Lastly, I do hereby appoint my friend John Clement of Lincicum Township in the County of Bucks sole executor of this my last will and testament.

In witness whereof, I John Wildonger the Testator have to this my will, set my hand and seal this thirtieth day of August A. D. One thousand, eight hundred and eighty-eight (1888.)
