I Joan Cork late wife of Edward late of Efford in the Parish of Eggburkland in the County of Devon but now of Lipston near Plymouth in the County of Devon aforesaid do make public and declare this to be my last will and testament in manner following (that is to say) first I give and bequeath unto my two sons William Cork and Josias Cork the sum of one Guinea each also I give and bequeath unto John Revell and Sampson Revell both of the Parishes of Eggburkland aforesaid Gentlemen the sum of five hundred pounds in Trust for my three daughters Elizabetha Samill (wife of John Samill Yeoman), Susanna Antiquy (wife of George Antiquy Yeoman) and Mary Cork equally to be divided between them clear and clear alike (subject to the proviso hereinafter contained) and respecting the payment and disposal thereof respectively to and by them I give and bequeath unto the said John Revell and Sampson Revell the sum of seven hundred pounds plus per Cent Consolidated Annuities upon the Trust herein after mentioned concerning the same (that is to say) In Trust that they my said Executors their Executors or Administrators shall and do pay the Interest Dividends and annual Dividend of the said seven hundred and thirty pounds here per Cent Consolidated Bank Annuities as the same shall become due and be received unto my daughter Joan Cork or other Heir and suffer her to have the same for and during the term of her natural life and from and immediately after her death to be paid as to the said sum of seven hundred and thirty pounds here per Cent Consolidated Annuities and the Interest Dividends and produce thereof respectively upon Trust for all and every the
