1816, Sept. 26. Newell, Hugh, of Freehold Twsp., Monmouth Co.; will of. Wife, Elizabeth, 2 beds and bedding, looking glass, 2 rooms in house with furnishings for same; use of a wagon and horses, firewood, 3 cows, the black boy Harry; 6 sheep, 6 silver tablespoons, 6 silver teaspoons, sugar tongs, the bees, brass andirons, shovel and tongs, for life but if she chooses to live elsewhere, then the occupant of said farm is to pay her \$40 quarterly every year during her life, and if she does choose to live there, she is to have \$50 yearly for life. If she marries again, all of above said privileges to cease and she is to have \$500 in lieu of dower. Son, John, wagon, the mares called Plato and Nell, certain farming implements and live stock; also homestead farm and tract of woodland near Stephen B. Heaviland, and its appurtenances for life, he paying \$1,500. At his death, to his son, Hugh, 1/2 of said farm and woodland, and other 1/2 thereof to Susannah (wife of my son, John), and my granddaughter, Elizabeth (daughter of said John and Susannah). If either of said grandchildren should die leaving no issue, such share to revert to my estate. Son, William, the farm at Menelopen, where he now resides, and the appurtenances, livestock and farming utensils, he paying \$4,000 to estate. Grandson, Hugh, a horse, and granddaughter, a heifer. Son, Thomas, his daughter, Ann, and his son, Asher, each \$100. Son, Samuel, \$5,500. Son, James, \$5,000. Daughter, Sarah Smock, \$3,000. Daughter, Mary, to have interest of \$3,000, and at her death same to return to estate. The farm whereon son, Samuel, lives and all other lands whatsoever, to be sold. Grandchildren, (children of William), i.e., William, \$100, Joanna, Phebe, James and Lydia, each \$50. Grandson, Hugh (son of Samuel), a horse. To John, Daniel, William and Elizabeth (the other children of said Samuel), \$100 to be divided equally. Azariah (son of James), \$50. Grandson, William Laird, and granddaughter, Mary Eliza Laird, each \$100. To Burnett Anderson, and his sister, Sarah Anderson, each \$10. Residue of estate to be divided into 7 equal shares. One share thereof to each of following, my wife, sons, John, William, Samuel, James, and daughters, Mary and Sarah. Executors—wife, Elizabeth\*, and son, William. Witnesses—Eleanor Conover, Samuel Forman, Caleb Lloyd. Proved Oct. 4, 1816.

1816, Dec. 10. Inventory, \$21,228.31; made by Denise Forman, Thomas C. Throckmorton. Includes carpenter tools and bench, turning lathe and tools, iron in blacksmith shop, cooper stuff, cherry boards in the Weaver Shop and long list of names in accounts. Includes also list of names in "Store Book Accounts", "Smith Book", and "Land Book". Sworn to by Executors, Apr. 26, 1820.
