left a loving father and mother to mourn the loss of a dutiful son. His whole desire was to do his duty and be a faithful defender of the gospel.

BROWN, Alexander, a member of the Mormon Battalion, was born March 3, 1826, near Lexington, North Carolina, the son of Captain James Brown and Martha Stephens. Becoming a convert to "Mormonism," together with his father's family, he was baptized by Jacob Foutz in Adams county, Illinois, in 1840. He was with the Saints in their persecutions in Illinois and came west in the exodus of Having arrived on the Missouri river in July of that year, he enlisted, together with his father and younger brother (Jesse), in the Mormon Battalion, and marched with that body to Sante Fe, whence he was as signed to the sick detachment under his father, Capt. James Brown, which spent the winter of 1846-1847 on the Arkansas river. The following spring the journey to Salt Lake Valley was continued and that place reached July 29, 1847. Alexander assisted in building the old fort in Sait Lake City. In the spring of 1848, after his father had purchased the Goodyear claim on the Weber river Alexander went to that locality with his father and plowed the first land in Weber county. The place where this first plowing was done was on a piece of ground lying between 28th and 29th streets of the present Ogden City survey, the land now being owned by James M. Brown on Washington avenue. The first furrow plowed ran east and west about fifty rods in length. During the gold excitement in 1849 Bro. Brown went to California. where he, on May 31, 1849, married Amanda McMurtray, in Greenwood valley, Sacramento county. She bore her husband eight children. From Greenwood valley Bro. Brown moved to San Bernardine, and returned to Utah about 1854. In 1856 he was ordained a High Priest and set apart to of the original Utah pioneers of 1847.

act as a second counselor to Bishop Chauncey W. West of the Ogden Third Ward. Alexander Brown continued a resident of Weber county the remainder of his life; he died in Ogden April 21, 1910, survived by his wife. six children, 27 grandchildren and 26 great-grandchildren.

BROWN. Ebenezer, a member of the Mormon Battalion and a pioneer of Utah, was born Dec. 6, 1802, at Salisbury, Herkimer county, New York. Becoming a convert to "Mormonism," he was baptized in 1835 in Crawford county, Pennsylvania. He shared with the Saints in their persecutions and was among the exiles of Nauvoo, Illinois, in 1846. When the call for the Mormon Battalion came to the camps of Israel on the Missour! river Ebenezer Brown was among those who proved their fidelity to their country by volunteering in its service. After his discharge from military duties, he located in Draper, Sait Lake county, in 1849, being the first settler of that place. In the latter part of 1850 he was called, together with many others, to form a settlement in Iron county, and thus became one of the founders of Parowan in January, 1851. Later he filled a mission to Carson Valley. where he remained until 1858, when the Carson Valley missionaries were released on account of the Johnston army troubles, and Brother Brown then returned to his former home in Draper, where he spent the remainder of his days and where he died Jan. 25, 1878. Brother Brown was numbered among those who through the vicissitudes of an eventful life never faltered in his faith in the principles of the gospel. He was alive to the interests of the Church of Christ and always ready to do whatever was necessary on his part to sustain it. He left a large family and a very wide circle of friends.

He built a cabin for his family in the southeast corner of the Salt Lake Valley. On 7 December 1850 he left Salt Lake City for Iron County, where he established a permanent community and founded a prosperous cattle business. In September 1852 Ebenezer was selected as a counselor to the presiding elder of the South Willow Creek Branch. By 1853 he was "a man of enough substance to support" additional wives (Hollist, Ebenezer Brown and His Descendants).

From 1854 to 1856 Ebenezer served as the first postmaster of South Willow Creek, even though he could not read or write. His wives carried out his postmaster duties. In 1856 he served a settling mission to Carson Valley, where he was a counselor to President Seth Dustin of the Washoe Branch.

Bbenezer returned to Salt Lake County to participate in the Utah War. After the threat of war diminished, he settled in Draper, Salt Lake County, where he remained for the next twenty years. There he built two homes (Hollist, Ebenezer Brown and His Descendants).

His health began to decline in the 1870s. He is remembered by his posterity as one who "never faltered in his faith in the principles of the gospel. Ebenezer was alive to the interests of the Church of Christ and always ready to do whatever was necessary to sustain it" (Hollist, Ebenezer Brown and His Descendants):

By 1808 Ebenezer was living with his parents in Dryden, Tompkins, New York. After his marriage to Ann, they moved to Summerhill, Crawford, Pennsylvania, where they owned fifty acres. In 1833 they sold their land in Summerhill and purchased one hundred acres in Conneaut, Crawford, Pennsylvania, for \$350. On 13 June 1835 Ebenezer was baptized into The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Crawford County (Hollist, Ebenezer Brown and His Descendants).

In 1836 he sold his acreage in Conneaut for \$1010 and migrated to Missouri to be with the Saints. In August 1838 he resided in Far West, Caldwell, Missouri, where on 2 January 1839 he was given his patriarchal blessing by Isaac Morley (Patriarchal Blessing Index) Because of religious persecution in Far West, Ebenezer was arrested and imprisoned with the Prophet Joseph Smith in Richmond,

Ray County (HC 3:211).

After being found innocent, he fled from Missouri to Quincy, Adams, Illinois, where he found that his wife was seriously ill. Phebe Draper Palmer, a widow with four children, moved into his home to care for Ann (Hollist, Ebenezer Brown and His Descendants) After Ann's death, Ebenezer married Phebe. She viewed this marriage as fulfillment of a patriarchal promise made to her by Joseph Smith, Sr. (Jenson, LDS Bio, 3:603).

Ebenezer and Phebe resided in Nauvoo, Hancock, Illinois, where he was ordained a high priest and was given his endowment on 24 December 1845 in the Nauvoo temple (Nauvoo Temple Register). Continual religious persecution prompted him to flee with his

family to Iowa Territory.

In Council Bluffs he enlisted in the Mormon Battalion. Phebe accompanied him on the battalion march. Her son, Zemira Palmer, also joined the battalion. The remaining children were left in Council Bluffs. Ebenezer's son, John Weaver Brown, wrote: "Father left us in very poor circumstances having no protection from the storm except our wagons and tents and only the protecting care of the Almighty from wicked men" (Hollist, Ebenezer Brown and His Descendants).

Ebenezer served as second sergeant in Company A until 18 March 1847, when his assignment changed to guarding the mission at San Luis Rey (Carter, Heart, 2:418). He was discharged on 16 July 1847 in Ciudad de los Angeles. Pour days later Ebenezer reenlisted in the Mormon Volunteers and served until 14 March 1848, when he was

discharged in San Diego.

The California gold rush induced he and his wife to remain in California near Sutter's Mill. Church records record: "Ebenezer Brown paid in tithing six ounces of gold dust and six dollars, total \$100.00" (Carter, Our, 9:503). Ebenezer and Phebe migrated from California in 1849 and arrived in the Salt Lake Valley, one week after their children arrived from Commoil Bluffs


