**Know** all Men by these presents that We Elizabeth  
 Queen of Great Brittain in these her Letters  
 under the Great Seal of Great Brittain bearing  
 in full the words following  
 are held and firmly bound unto Richard Smallbrooke Doctor of  
 Law Vicar general of the Diocese of Lichfield and Sarum  
 in the sum of Six hundred  
 Pounds of good and lawful Money of Great Brittain to  
 be paid unto the said Richard Smallbrooke or to  
 his certain Attorneys his Executors Administrators or Assignes  
 To whose Payment will and lawfully to be made We oblige ourselves  
 and every one of us by these presents sealed with our Seal  
 for the whole and every one of our heirs Executors  
 and Administrators firmly by these presents sealed with our Seal  
 Dated the 10th Day of April in the  
17th Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord  
 George the Third by the Grace of God of Great  
 Brittain France and Ireland King Defender of the Faith and  
 so forth. And in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven  
 Hundred and Seventy

**The Condition** of this Obligation is such that if the said  
 Administrator of all and singular the Goods Chattles  
 and Credits of Elizabeth Steane deceased do  
 make or cause to be made a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods  
 Chattles and Credits of the said deceased which shall come to the hands  
 Possession or Knowledge of the said Elizabeth Steane  
 or into the hands and Possession of any Person or Persons for her and  
 the same do make do exhibit or cause to be exhibited into the Registry of the Bishop  
 Court of Lichfield at or before the 10th Day of the next  
next ensuing and the same Goods Chattles and Credits and all other the Goods Chattles  
 and Credits of the said deceased at the time of her death which at any time after  
 shall come to the hands or Possession of any other Person or Persons for her do will and  
 lawfully administer according to Law. And further do make or cause to be made a true and  
 just Account of the said Administration at or before the 10th Day of  
the next and all the Rest and Residue of the said Goods Chattles and Credits  
 which shall be found remaining upon the said Administration Account the same being  
 first examined and allowed of by the Judge or Judges for the time being of the said Court  
 shall deliver and pay unto such Person or Persons respectively as the said Judge or Judges  
 by his or their Order or Sentence pursuant to the true Intent and Meaning of a late  
 Act of Parliament made in the two and twentieth and three and twentieth Year of the  
 Reign of our late Sovereign Lord King Charles the Second intituled an Act for the  
 better settling of Testaments which shall limit and appoint. And if it shall hereafter appear  
 that any last Will and Testament was made by the said deceased and the Executor or  
 Executors therein named do exhibit the same into the said Court making Request to have  
 it allowed and approved accordingly if the said the said  
 above bounden being thereunto required do render and deliver the said Letters of Admini-  
 stration (Approbation of such Testament being first had and made in the said Court  
 then this Obligation to be void, or else to remain in full Force and Virtue.
