Birth: 1662
Death: Apr. 14, 1726

Rev. Timothy Stevens was the son of Timothy S. of Roxbury, Mass. He graduated from Harvard in 1687 and commenced preaching in Glastonbury on April 17, 1692 in the old style. He married his first wife, Eunice Chester, daughter of Mr. John Chester of Wethersfield, Ct on May 17, 1694 by whom he had:

Timothy, born March 23, 1695 and died April 1695

Sarah, born March 19, 1696 and died September 25, 1717

John, born June 4, 1698 and died the same month

His wife died June 16, 1698 (probably from complications of childbirth)

He married his second wife, Alice Cook, daughter of Joseph Cook by whom he had:
John, born September 13, 1702 and died August 30, 1717

Eunice, born September 14, 1704 and died September 19, 1704

Martha, born September 6, 1705 and died November 7, 1717

Twin sons, born September 8, 1707 and died at one day old

Timothy, born July 9, 1709

Joseph, born August 15, 1711

Benjamin, born March 1714

"On July 28, 1692, a call was given to Rev. Timothy Stevens to settle among, and work in the Gospel ministry at L60 a year. The call was accepted by Mr. Stevens, who had been preaching some months previously in Glastonbury."

"Rev. Mr. Stevens seems to have been a quiet, discreet, peace loving man, faithful in his office, but not specially energetic in those departments not immediately connected with his profession."

"He seems to have permitted his people to pay him what, and when, as they pleased. Nor does he seem to have suffered in the end by so doing, if we may judge from the extent of his property and possession. The parsonage, so called, near the meeting house, with several acres of land in the vicinity - a considerable tract on the meadows - four hundred acres at Red Hill, and one hundred and fifty acres adjoining Middletown bounds, and one hundred acres at Diamond Pond, was the list of his real estate."

Rev. Mr. Stevens died April 14, 1726 in the sixty-first year of his age.
