Understanding as formerly yet not knowing the Day of my Death & Desiring  
to have peace amongst my Children whom I am gone from them is therefore after  
the resigning of my spirit to god who gave it & my body to a decent buriall of God  
Dispose of what god hath given me as followeth

I give & give to my son John Stow Stow one parcel of Land in Millston on the west  
sid the Great River both that within & that without the fence which is mine more  
I give to my said son my Great Lott after my decess more over I give him the  
one halfe of my great Lott at the Straits hills

If I give to my son Nathaniel both my house hom Lott & Lott in the bogie meadow  
Quartr which is made sure to him by a former contract that is to him and to  
my son Thomas & Samuel both the other halfe of my Great Lott at the  
Straits hills & my half mill Lott on the East sid the Great River to be divided  
Equally amongst them more over I give to my son Nathaniel all my household  
Goods after my decess peaceably to enjoy with all my part in the Cabal & Swine  
And that this is my will & full intent I witness by setting to my hand  
January 26. 1680
