

John Slifer, Jr., Peter Miller, Peter Garber, and Rudolph Brown (of Big Conewago Congregation, PA) followed the old road down Marsh Creek until they reached the Monocacy Trail and then journeyed south to Frederick, Maryland. They lodged in the homes of some early Brethren settlers in Frederick County and then moved across Braddock Heights and caught their first glimpse of their future home in the fertile Middletown Valley. They stopped with their families on top of the mountain and prepared dinner by the road side. John Schleiffer appears to have been the only minister in the group and he conducted Thanksgiving on the mountain top, after which the party journeyed to their new homes in the forests near the village of Burkittsville. Peter Miller and Peter Garber, both on the same date, November 23, 1770, bought land from Daniel Arnold and settled upon it, about a mile south of Burkittsville. Rudolph Brown settled across the South Mountain in Pleasant Valley, near Brownsville, after whom the town was named. John Schleiffer did not purchase land for several years, until November 6, 1783, when he bought from David Harvey.

The pioneer family of John Schleiffer is one of the oldest Brethren families. The Slifers of Maryland are descendents of the old pioneer and pathfinder, John Schleiffer, who came from the Rhine Valley during the days of fiery persecution. John Schleiffer, Sr. was born in Germany and emigrated to America where he settled in Bucks Co., PA, within the bounds of the Great Swamp Congregation. Church records show that he was baptized in 1735 by the Great Brethren Elder, Peter Becker, one of the earliest fathers of the church. Here in Great Swamp, the Slifer family got its start in America, and there in the Old Brecht (Bright) Cemetery still lie some of those early pioneer Slifers. John Slifer, Jr. was born in 1743, and early became a member of the church and moved into the Burkittsville community in 1770. Little is known of the wife of John Slifer, Jr. except that court records list her name as Asanath Gaver. They were the grandparents of the well-known Emanuel Slifer, Brethren Elder. The name John Schleiffer, together with the names of Daniel Arnold, Daniel Leatherman, Alexander Mack, Jr. and others appear on a letter of advice circulated in 1763 among the churches concerning the problems of the visions of Catherine Humer in the White Oak Church. But this was likely John Schleiffer, Sr. as his son would have been only 21 years of age at this time. John Slifer died on October 17, 1822, at the age of 79 years, five months.

Note: Another source says John was born in Rhine Valley, Germany
