 perfect mind and memory, thank be to God, calling to  
 entertain the mortality of my body, and knowing that it  
 is appointed for all people here to die, do make  
 and declare this my last Will and Testament, That is  
 to say principally and first of all I give and recom-  
 mend my soul into the hands of Almighty God,  
 that gave it and my body I recommend to the earth  
 to be buried in decent Christian manner at the  
 discretion of my friends, nothing doubting but at  
 the general resurrection I shall receive the same  
 again by the mighty power of God. — and all  
 my worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased  
 God to bless me with, in this life I give, demise  
 and dispose of to my loving Sister Francis White  
 first of all I give to her all my rights of all Lands, plus  
 three Cows and Calves also all my Cloathing, One gold  
 ring, one bed and furniture, and all my howing  
 furniture, also all the debts that is due to me —  
 Ratifying this to be my last Will and Testament  
 In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand  
 and seal this twenty sixth day of February in the  
 year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and  
 Ninety two and in the seventeenth year of Indepen-  
 dency of America
