 for the same now calling to mind the mortality of my Body Hereby giving that 502  
 it is appointed once for man once to dye, he make this my last will and  
 Testament in manner and form following. And first I give and recommend  
 my Soul into the hand of Almighty God who gave it, and my Body I recommend  
 to the Earth to be Buried in a Christian like and decent manner at the Dis-  
 cretion of my Executors hereafter named, I bid us touching such worldly  
 Estate as the Lord in mercy has been <sup>pleas'd</sup> to Bless me with in this life give  
 devise and dispose and dispose of in the following manner and form  
 And my will is that my funeral charges and just debts be fully paid from I give  
 And bequeath to my beloved wife Eleanor fifty acres of my land during  
 her Natural life to be laid out as follows to begin at that corner of  
 my land next Eleanor Lurgs Mill and extend along the Mill Road  
 toward the Street Road half the length of my land to a corner thence  
 across my land half the breadth to a corner and thence by my land the  
 half length thereof to a corner and from thence to the place of beginning  
 also I give and bequeath unto wife all my personal Estate during her  
 Natural life and after her decease the above said fifty acres of land with  
 the personal Estate to be sold and equally divided between my five children  
 hereafter named viz William Daniel Joseph Richard and Lane Noto  
 My mind and will is that if any of my five above mentioned children  
 should happen to dye before they are of age that their share of Legacy shall  
 be equally divided amongst the survivors of those five - That I give and  
 bequeath unto my daughter Mary one pound to be paid her one year after  
 my wifes decease. That I give and bequeath unto my eldest son John the  
 remainder of my land with all the improvements upon it, or any wife appertain-  
 ing thereto with the pragon and my working land to him and his heirs and  
 assigns forever upon this condition viz that he pay or cause to be paid all my  
 just debts that is by me contracted before the date hereof and also my  
 funeral charges if I dye before I stand to the above mentioned fifty acres of  
 land that I give to my wife, but if I live to get to the above said land that  
 then the funeral charges be paid of the personal Estate and also that my said  
 son John shall build on the above mentioned fifty acres of land for my wife or  
 stone house one story high with a shipt roof covered with Cedar shingles and a  
 cellar under it the length of it to be twenty feet in the clear and the breadth to be sixteen  
 in the clear and to make two floors with good boards and a partition in it both above  
 and below wall and workman like and the above said house to be built on my said  
 sons Johns own proper cost and charges Noto My mind and will is that if my son  
 John should decline to perform the above conditions or be removed by death before  
 the debts are paid that then the Executor and Executrix hereafter named is hereby au-  
 thorized to sell the above mentioned remainder of the land and pay the debts  
 and also to performe the condition <sup>on his part</sup> <sup>in respect</sup> <sup>of the</sup> <sup>land</sup> <sup>and</sup> <sup>pay</sup> <sup>the</sup> <sup>debts</sup>  
 which when that is done the Executor and Executrix is to pay or cause to be  
 paid unto him the remainder of the price of the Land. Lastly I do hereby  
 constitute make and ordain my wife Eleanor Executrix and my son William  
 Executor of this my last will and Testament, utterly disallowing and  
 revok and Dissolve all and every other former Testaments wills Legacies

Bequests and Executors by me in any wise before this time named willode  
 and bequeathed Ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will  
 and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal

 by the said John Hough as his last will and Testament in the presence of us

3) Be it Remembered that on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of November, Anno Domini 1744 was  
 duly proved according to law the last will and Testament of John Hough of Solisbury  
 in the County of Bucks & Province of Pennsylvania deceased and Probate &  
 Letters Testamentary was granted to Elmer Hough & William Hough Executors therein  
 named Being first solemnly affirmed well & truly to administer the Goods Chattels rights  
 & Credits of said deceased and to exhibit a true & perfect Inventory of the Estate of said  
 deceased in one month after Date hereof and also & Just acc<sup>t</sup> when required &  
 given under the Seal of the Registers Office of Marshall Dep. Reg.
