James Fullwood (b. 1785, d. January 27, 1876)

James Fullwood^{309, 309, 309, 309, 309} was born 1785 in North Carolina, USA^{309, 309, 309, 309, 309}, and died January 27, 1876 in Ware, Georgia, USA^{309, 309, 309, 309, 309}. He married **Mary Henderson** on August 10, 1815 in Telfair, Georgia, USA^{309, 309}, daughter of **Randall McKendrick Henderson** and **Nancy C Smith**.

Notes for **James Fullwood**:

James Fullwood was born in North Carolina in 1785, and he was a son of Thomas Fullwood, R.S. With his parents he came to Georgia about 1800, and while his parents later settled in Wayne County where they died it appears that James remained in Montgomery County for a few years in his young manhood. He was elected Justice of Peace of the 54th district in that county and commissioned October 1, 1812, serving the unexpired term. He was married in Telfair county August 10, 1815, to Miss Mary Pollie Henderson, born 1800 in N.C., daughter of David Henderson, R.S. Sometime about 1860, Mrs Fullwood died, and Mr. Fullwood married Mrs. Jane Brabham Walker, a widow and sister of Thomas Brabham, a local Methodist preacher of Ware county. She died about 1880. There were no children by either marriage.

James Fullwood and wife lived in Tatnall County a few years and then moved to the new county of Appling in 1819, and when Ware County was founded out of Appling in December 1824, they were cut into that county. In the organization of the county that followed a few months later and the laying out of the county into militia districts, James Fullwood was elected one of the first two Justices of Peace in the 451st (Waresboro) district, and commissioned July 26, 1825, serving one year. He then was elected to the state senate from Ware County and served as senator from 1827 to 1834, inclusive, also in 1836, 1837, 1841, and 1842. He also served nearly twenty years in the office of Justice of Inferior Court, to-wit; 1833-1844 and 1849-1857.

Mr. Fullwood's will dated January 12, 1871 was probated April 3, 1876 in Ware Court of Ordinary. It bequeathed to his wife Jane his home place of 290 acres of lot 86, 8th district, also all of lots 140 and 141 in same district, also all his cattle and other personal property, all to be his wife's for her lifetime and then to descend to his nieces by marriage, Mrs. Harriet Henderson who married two nephews of Mr. Fullwood, viz; John W. Henderson and after his death to William L. Henderson, having children by both marriages. Certain personal property was given Wm. L. Henderson and James W. Fullwood, nephews of the testator. All the remainder of his estate was given to his wife. Rev. Wm. A. McDonald, Rev. Thomas Brabham and Thomas Sweat were named executors.

Mr. Fullwood died at his home in Ware County, Jan 27, 1876. A newspaper article published about his death in "The Valdosta Times" the following week, said he was 90 years and a few months old, and said the deceased had had his coffin made of selected wood at least fifteen years before he died, and that he kept it upstairs in his home.
