 Testament

1st I give and Bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Dilis
 Hopper, daughter of my Daughter Frances Blackwell
 one feather Bed and Furniture and one Silver Man's Belt,
 and to her heirs forever -

2.^{dy} To my beloved wife Mary ^{the} Hooper I give the use of all the real and
 residue of my Estate, both real and personal, during her natural life
 and after her decease I give the same (my Just debts being first paid) to
 be equally divided between my following children and grand children
 (Viz) Jonema Tapp, wife of William Tapp, Elizabeth Tapp wife of -
 Vincent Tapp, William borna Thomas Butler, and the aforementioned -
 Delia Hooper, and their true heirs

3.^{dy} I hereby constitute and appoint my Son in Law Vincent Tapp
 and my Grand Son William borna, Executors of this my last Will
 and Testament. and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannul
 all former Wills and Testaments, ratifying and Confirming this and
 no other to be my last will and Testament, In Witness whereof I
 have hereunto set my hand and Seal the day and year first above
 written.
