



Barnes-Duncan Divorce_Semi Weekly Age (Coshocton OH) 12 Jun 1888

THE divorce case of Hattie L. Barnes vs. Dr. Enos P. Barnes, was called Thursday morning, May 31, in the Millersburg court, and occupied two days and a half. This case has attracted considerable attention, consequently the court room was pretty well filled during the progress of the trial. The case was submitted to the court on the following Saturday. On last Thursday morning Judge Dowell rendered his decision in favor of the plaintiff, and placed the defendant under a bond of \$500 for his appearance on Friday morning for contempt of court. The Farmer says the remarks of the court in reference to the defendant and the character of the testimony introduced in his behalf were even more severe than those made by Judge Parsons in a former divorce suit of the Doctor's. The plaintiff was sustained in the charges preferred in her petition and restored to her maiden name, Hattie L. Duncan. The Judge gave her as alimony a \$600 note which had been sold by Dr. Barnes in contempt of court last fall, and two town lots in Coshocton, which had been also sold and deeds given, but the deeds were set aside. The parties have relatives here and are well known.
