

I, William Murphy, of the town of Court, County of Seneca and State of New York, considering the uncertainty of this mortal life, and being of sound mind and memory, do make and publish this my last will and testament, in manner and form following, that is to say, -

First. I give and bequeath to my son, Isaac Murphy, the farm on which I now reside, containing One hundred and One Acres, one rood and six rods of land, and bounded as follows: Beginning on the west line of Lot Number Forty one, and at the southwest corner of land belonging to Samuel Bassett, and running from thence East, Fifty-nine rods; thence South, Five rods; Thence East, Two rods; Thence North, Five rods; Thence East, One hundred and twenty two rods; Thence South, Eighty-eight rods and fifteen links; Thence West One hundred and eighty three rods; Thence North Eighty eight rods and twelve links to the place of beginning, to have and to hold the same during his natural life, and after his death, to be divided equally among his children. -

Second. I give and bequeath unto my son, Isaac Murphy and Ann Demund, wife of Aaron S. Demund, the one third of all the money that I may have on hand or at interest, at the time of my death, after paying my funeral charges, to be paid to them, within two years after my death, -

Third. I give and bequeath unto Rachel Cory, Elizabeth King, wife of Eldah Cory, Jacob King and George S. Vanorman, the one third of all the money that I may have on hand or at interest, at the time of my death, after paying my funeral charges, to be paid to them within two years after my death. -

Fourth. I give and bequeath unto William Murphy, son of Isaac Murphy, Mary Johnson, wife of William Johnson, and William Cristolur, the one third of all the money that I may have on hand or at interest, at the time of my death, after defraying my funeral charges, to be paid to them within two years after my death.


Fifth. I give and bequeath to my son Isaac Murphy all ^{of} my wearing apparel.

Sixth. I give and bequeath to my son Isaac Murphy, and Ann Demund, wife of Aaron S. Demund my house hold property, to be equally divided betwixt them.

Seventh. I give and bequeath to my son, Isaac Murphy the remainder of my personal property.

And lastly, I hereby appoint my much esteemed friends, Peter Wickoff & James K. Court, of the town of Ovid, County and State aforesaid, Executors of this my last will & Testament - hereby revoking all other wills by me made.

In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 20th day of November 1845.
