A book called " SCOTCH IRISH PIONEERS " in Ulster and America

This book is to do with the Scotch/Irish that came to America from the Ulster Plantation in Ireland around 1718 to Boston Mass. A large group of these settlers broke away from the group in Boston and moved north to New Hampshire where they settled and called the place Londonderry N.H. this is very close to Dunstable where David Adams Sr lived. In this book page 262,263,264 it lists the names of the Early Settlers of Londonderry, N.H., many of whom remained only a short time and moved on to new plantations. The fourth name on this list is a WILLIAM ADAMS, I have no information on this fellow but I did find where a Wm Adams was a tax payer in Dunstable, N.H. before 1750. I feel that there is a large chance that this Wm Adams may have been the father of David Adams Sr.
