Description

This data collection contains an estimated 80,000 application files from officers and enlisted men who served in the Revolutionary War in all branches of the American military: army, navy, and marines. The files that make up these records consist of 10" x 14" cards or 10" x 14" envelopes that can contain documents relating to an application for a pension or bounty-land warrant by a Revolutionary War veteran, his widow, or his heirs. The files can contain a wide variety of records submitted to support an application. Information of genealogical interest includes the application itself, which can provide the soldier's name, rank, unit, time of service, age, date of birth, residence, and sometimes birthplace.

State of New York *Sp.* On this 19th day of September 1820
Lewis County I personally appeared in open Court, to wit,

in the Court of Common Pleas, held at the Court House
in the Town of Martinsburg in and for the County of Lewis
the same being a Court of Record in and for the said County,
proceeding according to the Course of the Common
Law, with a Jurisdiction unlimited in point of amount,
keeping a record of its proceedings, and possessing a
Seal - Timothy Briley aged sixty seven years, resident in
Leyden in said County, who being first duly sworn according
to Law, doth on his oath declare, that he served in the revolu-
tionary War as follows, as a private in a Company com-
manded by Captain Charles Bond in Col. Peter S. Skiffs
Regiment, Connecticut Line, as set forth in his original
Declaration which bears date the 22^d April 1818. -

That he has received a pension, and the number of his pen-
sion Certificate is 12,002 - And I do solemnly swear
that I was a resident Citizen of the United States on the 18th
day of March 1818. and that I have not since that time,
by Gift, Sale, or in any manner, disposed of my property,
or any part thereof, with intent thereby to diminish it,
as to bring myself within the provisions of an Act of
Congress, entitled "An Act to provide for certain persons
engaged in the Land and Naval Service of the United
States in the revolutionary War" passed on the 18th
March 1818. - And I have not, nor has any person
in trust for me, any property or Securities, Contracts
or debts due to me, nor have I any income, other than
what is contained in the Schedule hereto annexed, and
by me subscribed. - And this deponent further said

that his Occupation is Farming; that in consequence as well of old age and ill health, as of having lost the use of three fingers of his right hand, and the use of the thumb of his left hand, he is unable to pursue his Occupation - And that his Family consists only of himself and his wife Anna Bailey aged Fifty five Years -

Dear Sir:

Reference is made to your letter of December 17, 1831, requesting information in regard to Timothy Bailey, a soldier of the Revolution.

The data contained herein are obtained from papers on file in the pension claim, S. 44574, based upon the service of Timothy Bailey in the Revolutionary War.

While a resident of Haddam, Connecticut, he enlisted in 1777 as private in Captain Charles Pond's Company in Colonel Estern J. Meigs' 6th Connecticut Regiment. He was in the battle of Elizabethtown and was discharged December 25, 1780.

He was allowed pension on his application executed April 23, 1818, at which time he was living in Leyden, Lewis County, New York.

In 1820 he stated that he was sixty-seven years of age and referred to his wife, Anna, aged fifty-five years.

There are no data relative to children.

In reply to your undated letter, received on the 20th instant, you are advised that Timothy Bailey, Revolutionary War Pensioner Sur. File No. 44,574, was sixty-five years old in 1818, date of birth not given.

In order to obtain the date of last payment of pension and probable date of death, also place of his residence at death, application should be made to the Auditor for the Interior Department, U. S. Treasury Department, citing the following data:

"Timothy Bailey, Certificate No. 12,003, issued June 17, 1819, at the rate of \$8. per month from April 22, 1818, under Act of March 18, 1818, at the New York Agency."
