Description: This document proves that William Wheeler who married Mary Friend died in Washington Co, VA prior to Nov 1815 and not in 1830 in TN. His estate was still on the books as late as 1830, but William Wheeler was deceased. Daniel Arnett, one of the estate appraisers, married the aunt of William's son Charles' first wife.
