





I, Philip G. Young Do hereby certify that the fifteenth day of Sept  
 1833, Henry H. Sampson Recorder of September 1833, embodied the same eight hundred thirty two  
 Philip G. Young of the town of McMans County of Ohio State of Pennsylvania the first  
 and Henry H. Sampson of the second part. At days with that which is the  
 of Washington high Sheriff of the County of Ohio State of Pennsylvania by deed  
 under his hand and seal bearing date the ninth day of January on this  
 eight hundred and twenty five for the consideration therein mentioned did by virtue  
 of a certain writ of fieri facias issue out of the Court Common Pleas of the  
 County of Ohio bearing date the twelfth day of May on this said eight hundred and  
 twenty one to the Sheriff of the said County, direction was commanded that of goods  
 and chattels lands and tenements of Rufus Spruce and Benjamin Duster he  
 should cause to be levied a certain debt of ninety three dollars and eighty five cents  
 with cost of suit and the said Sheriff returned to the Judges of said Court that he had  
 seized and taken in execution the following divided piece or parcel of land situate  
 in McMans Township Ohio County of Ohio of Benjamin Duster at the north east corner of  
 a half acre part of lot 11 that he in his said Township there was contained one six  
 tenths of an acre and in the parcel there was one hundred and sixty perches  
 more with one hundred perches of the piece of Benjamin Duster containing one hundred and  
 twenty perches being part of tract of land Survey was returned one account in  
 the name of John Duster which remained in his hands unsold for want of buyer  
 whereas by a certain writ of Writ executed upon the said Court  
 bearing date the twelfth day of August on this said eight hundred and twenty  
 one to the said Sheriff directed he was commanded that the said Benjamin Duster  
 of one piece of land of one hundred acres with the appurtenances to be him seized  
 and taken in execution as aforesaid he should so sell and the said Sheriff  
 having given due and legal notice of the time and place of sale and if the said land  
 was then on the Seventh day of November on this said eight hundred and twenty one



his heirs and assigns, to the only proper benefit and behoof of the said Henry  
 his heirs and assigns forever And the said Philip his heirs executors and adminis-  
 trators does hereby Covenant promise grant and agree to and with the said Henry  
 his heirs and assigns by them that he the said Philip his heirs and assigns with  
 whose mention and descent premises hereby granted or mentioned or intended shall  
 with the said Henry against the said Philip and his heirs  
 and against all and every person or persons lawfully claiming or to claim by force  
 or maintenance or otherwise shall give <sup>will</sup> warrant and foreward by this present  
 In Witness whereof the party to these presents has hereunto set their hands and seals  
 the day and year above written.
