Obituary.

George Nelson Gardner was born in Norwich, Conn., June 4th 1831, and died at his home in this city, Nov. 20th, 1898.

He came with his parents to Hilmois when 14 years of age. He was married to Elvira L. Casewell Jan. 181, 1851; and came to Waverly, this state, in 1859. Five children were born to them, three sons and two daughters, all of whom are living, who with their mother today mourn the death of a kind husband and father.

The deceased enlisted in Co. B., 38th I. V. I. in 1862 and served until the close of the war.

He was a member of Carpenter Post of the Grand Army of the Republic, of Fredericksburg.

His health was never good after being mustered out of service, and during the last year of his life he was confined to his bed a large part of the time.

He was converted and united with the Baptist church at Waverly in 1860; joined the church of the United Brethern in Christ, at Finnell chapel, in 1890, and transferred his membership to the United Brethern church, of Sumner, in 1895, of which church he remained a constant member until his death.

The funeral services were held on the afternoon of Nov. 21st, at the United Brethern church.

Gardner, George N. Age 31. Residence Waverly, nativity Connecticut. Enlisted Aug. 11, 1862. Mustered Nov. 4, 1862. Promoted Sergeant Feb. 3, 1863; Transferred to Company I, Thirty-fourth and Thirty-eighth Consolidated, Jan. 1, 1865. Mustered out May 18, 1865, St. Louis, Mo

The regiment received this nickname because over a third of its number died of disease in the latter months of 1863 in Louisiana & Mississippi after the Siege of Vicksburg. Others were discharged disabled and died on the trip home or soon after. There were so few able-bodied men left that the 38th lowa was combined with the 34th lowa Infantry.
