# ANOTHER VETERAN ANSWERS TAPS

JOHN DAVID CASWELL, CIVIL WAR VETERAN PASSES AWAY AT HIS HOME IN SUMNER LAST THURS-DAY EVENING.

John David Caswell, was born in Betyidere, Hilinois, March 7, 1838, and died January 22, 1925, at the age of 86 years, 9 months and 21 days.

Mr. Caswell was a voteran of the Civil War, having enlisted in the army in 1862. He served ninety days and was discharged because of ill health.

He is survived by a wife, also four daughters and one son by a former wife.

Mr. Caswell has been in poor health for many years, but through it all he has been uncomplaining and cheerful. Early last week he suffered a stroke which was the direct cause of his death.

Mr. Caswell has been long a resident of Sumner and for some years was engaged in business here. He was admired by all as a friend and neighbor, and his death is truly regretted.

Funeral services were held Sunday afternoon from the home with services at the M. E. Church in charge of Rev. W. H. Mitchell. Burial was made at Union Mound cemetery, where members of the Thomas E. Woods Post of the American Legion marched in a body out of respect to a departed comrade of the colors. The impressive Legion Services were hold at the grave.
