DANSBEE CEMETERY - In 1885 this cemetery was located on the Easley farm in Council Bend. Burials here came from various issues of the Hickman Pioneer for the month given in the listing. Research by Mrs. Jill Garrett. (I could not locate the cemetery. CGL)

BREECE, Mary - Age 20 - d. Sept. 1885 of tuberculosis.
 " , Savannah - age 12 yrs. 11 mos. - d. Sept. 27, 1878.

GARTON, Jack - drowned in Duck River. Was from Dickson County.

DARDEN CEMETERY (Revisited) - is on the Nellie Warren farm known as the old Jack Tarkington farm. It is on the old road from Little Lot to Centerville. Revisited by Nellie Gray Warren, Mr. & Mr. Bruce Tatum, and LaVerne Marsh. The last 3 were looking for relative's stones and they "kept digging". They have added much to the original write-up which is on page 112 of SACRED TO THE MEMORY, Part 1. Notes are Mr. Tatum's. After the 1976 printing of the Cemetery Records, Part 2, Bruce and Ruby Tatum and Don Martin were instrumental in having the various military markers placed on these gravesites. Information updated by Ruby Tatum, August, 1987.

- (BAIRD, Edward M. - June 14, 1884 - ? . He was a bro. to Lizzie Audrey Baird Meadows, who stated that he had a marker, but Mr. Tatum could not find it. This from Mrs. Meadows' Bible.)
- (" , Lizzie E. - Sept. 24, 1885 - Nov. 10, 1897. This stone was dug up by Bruce Tatum in Feb. 1976! (Sister to Audrey)
- " , Jane Clampitt - Apr. 1802 - Nov. 2, 1878 (This tombstone was in 7 pieces! Bruce Tatum put it together.)
- " , Maj. E.M. - March 1, 1797 - Mar. 25, 1883 (This stone was buried under the soil. Spence, in his HISTORY OF HICKMAN COUNTY, TENNESSEE, p. 33 of the reprint, says: "Edwin BAIRD was a son of Samuel McClearn Baird, who was born in Buncomb Co., N.C., on Mar. 1, 1799. His wife was Jane Clampitt, who was born in Wilson County, Tenn., in April, 1802 and who was married on July 20, 1820."
- DARDEN, Alford B. - 1842-1901 - PVT. CO. H 11TH REGT. TENN INF CONFEDERATE STATES ARMY
- " , Alford D. - June 20, 1802 - Mar. 13, 1872 - married Oct. 3, 1822. 2ND LT: CO. A I REGT. TENN. INF. MEXICAN WAR
- " , Benjamin G. 1826-1901 PVT CO A I REGT. TENN. INF. MEXICAN WAR
- " , Elizabeth J. (Caughorn) Wife of A Darden - Nov. 9, 1822-Feb. 14, 1883. (This marker was buried. E.J is thought to be the last wife of Alford Darden. These are g-g grandparents of Bruce Tatum.)
- " , Henry G. - Oct. 21, 1823 - Mar. 26, 1896.) PVT CO A I REGT. TENN. INF. MEXICAN WAR
- " , Martha (Cotham) - Jan 6, 1823 - Aug. 1, 1908)
- " , Mary D. - Dec. 13, 1803 - Oct. 8, 1863 (1st wife of Alford Darden. Henry was the son of Alford)
- (" , Mary (Tarkington) - wife of Leverage Darden. Has no marker, but known to be the dau. of Jack & Rebecca Tarkington)
- (" , Melinda - daughter of Henry Darden - d. Sept. 19, 1875 of congestive chills. COLUMBIA HERALD, Sept. 1875. (A great aunt of Bruce Tatum who knows she is buried here in an unmarked grave.)
- GRINER, L.P. - 1830 -1885.) (Husband of Fannie) PVT CO G 10 REGT TENN C.S.A.
- " , Fannie - 1841 - 1908) (She was kin to the Dardens)
- " , L.P. - Oct. 3, 1833 - Apr. 8, 1885 (This is a carved stone- correct?)

Near the graves on the previous page are two infant graves with O.G. on each stone.

The following are from Bible records of Fannie Yates, g-dau-of:

(TARKINGTON, Capt. Jack - Aug. 2, 1817 - Nov. 24, 1884)

(TARKINGTON, Rebecca Hunter Tarkington - Wife of Capt. Jack - Jan. 17, 1811-
Apr. 18, 1885.)

DEDMON CEMETERY - was located by the statement of Mr. Cecil Hatley who is 80 years old. It is on the John Warren place, formerly known as the old Taylor Jones place. 5 or 6 unmarked graves and Mr. Hatley's parents told him some Dedmons were buried here. This cemetery is now marked only by some huge cedar trees. The fieldstones that once marked the graves have been scattered.

DODD CEMETERY - is on the old Dave Dodd place, later called the Miles Brown place. North of Pinewood School, turn right and go about one-half mile past an old community called Luzon. Cemetery is on the right, a little away from the road and is unfenced, overgrown with briars, and is over-run by cattle. Listed Jan. 21, 1976 by Mr. Foster Clark and Mr. & Mrs. O.J. Lynn. Parentheses are by Mrs. Hattie Lou Gunniff Lambert who gave information by telephone. 35 to 40 unmarked graves in an area about 200 ft. across.

BOOKER, Larence - Dau. of W.B. & Pearl Booker - Sept. 26, 1911 - Feb. 11, 1912
(Pearl Booker was a dau. of Fannie Priest Lewis, a sister of Ella Dodd)

BROWN, Lou Ella (Priest) Dodd - Dec. 30, 1867 - Mar. 29, 1951. (She m. Billy Brown after Dave Dodd died. He lived on the next farm and was tax assessor at one time. Lou Ella was the grandmother of Hattie Lou Lambert)

BOOKER, Infant son of W.B. & Pearl Booker - Nov. 6, 1912 - Nov. 7, 1912.

CUNNIFF, Lula - Apr. 23, 1888 - Apr. 23, 1924 (Dau. of Dave and Ella Priest Dodd and mother of Hattie Lou Lambert)

DODD, Charley - Son of D.A. and Ella Dodd - July 17, 1891 - Oct. 10, 1902.

" , D.A. - June 27, 1857 - Dec. 7, 1902 (Grandfather of Hattie L. Lambert)

" , Demus Ewel - Son of D.A. & Ella Dodd - Sept. 21, 1900 - Oct. 22, 1902.

ELKINS, Wylie B. - Feb. 16, 1887 - Nov. 18, 1925 - Husband of Elsie Dodd (twin)
Someone from Hickman Co. was working in Detroit and was asked by Wylie Elkins about some Tennessee girl who was good-looking and would make him a good wife. Elsie Dodd was suggested and Mr. Elkins, a wealthy man, came to see Elsie. They were married in a fancy wedding with trellises and roses at the old Goodrich Hotel which was being operated by her sister, Lula Dodd Gunniff. The Elkins couple had 2 sons, 1 of whom is buried near his father, Aubrey Elkins is living in Florida in 1976; Elsie is living in Dickson, Tenn.

PETTY, Earl R - Son of W.A. & Mollie - July 17, 1909 - Mar. 23, 1910. (Mollie Priest was the sister of Ella Priest Dodd)

" , Hubert - son of W.A. and Mollie - June 4, 1900 - Oct. 13, 1900.

" , Infant Son of W.A. & L.M. - Oct. 7, 1907

" , Louise - dau. of W.A. & Mollie - Dec. 19, 1903 - Aug. 26, 1904.

" , Myrtle G. - dau. of W.A. & Mollie - Nov. 7, 1898 - July 22, 1899.

" , William Curl - Son of W.A. & Mollie - May 5, 1896 - Dec. 5, 1898.

WASHTON, Mildred - dau. of J.G. & Sarah - Mar. 8, 1848 - Oct. 4, 1862. (This marker is down.)
