

MOUNT CARMEL WOMAN DIES ON VISIT IN SOUTH

**Heart Attack Fatal To Mrs.
Mary Kessler While Vaca-
tioning In Virginia**

A Mount Carmel woman, Mrs. Mary Kessler, 54, died suddenly late Thursday in a hospital at Newport News, Virginia, where she had been vacationing with relatives.

In a telegram received this morning, members of the family were informed that Mrs. Kessler suffered a heart attack while on a fishing trip yesterday, was removed to the hospital where doctors resorted to the use of adrenalin in a vain effort to

save her life.

Mrs. Kessler, a widely-known resident of 15 north Chestnut street, this city, left on Friday of last week with her son-in-law and daughter, Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Millard, of Tower City, on an automobile trip to Virginia. With them were two children of Mrs. Kessler's son, Charles, this city. After a week's vacation as guests of Mrs. Kessler's brother-in-law, George Kessler, at Newport News, they had planned to return home either yesterday or today.

The telegram included that the body will be sent from Newport News to arrive here Saturday morning. Funeral arrangements were not completed today.

Mary Elizabeth (Jones) Kessler was born at William Penn, near Shenandoah, on October 19, 1883, a daughter of the late Jacob and Mary Elizabeth (Bach) Jones. She was 12 years old when her parents moved to Mount Carmel and she had been a resident here ever since.

She was a member of the St. Paul Evangelical Church, the Missionary Society of the church, the Daughters of America, the Daughters of Liberty, and the Shepherds of Bethlehem.

Her husband, Edward W. Kessler, who was an outside foreman at the Sayre colliery, succumbed to a heart attack while at work on January 9, 1929.

To survive are six children, Earl, of Cleveland, Charles, Phillip and Willard, of Mount Carmel, Alma, wife of Joseph Millard, Tower City, and John, at home. Another daughter, Esther, wife of Walter Harbold, Audubon, New Jersey, died October 10, 1933.

Other survivors are 14 grandchildren and a brother, James Jones, of Odio, Ohio. It was only two weeks ago that Mrs. Kessler was notified of the death July 23 at Alberta, Canada, of a sister, Mrs. Ruth Melbin, whom she (Mrs. Kessler) had not seen since she was five years old. Another brother, Isaac Jones, of Helfenstein, died two years ago.
