Now these may certify whom it may concern that for a full accomplishment of their intentions this 13th day of 1st mo 1791.

They appeared in a public meeting of the aforesaid people met together at this weekday meeting near Turners Swamp, and the said Elijah Coleman taking the said Mary Parker by the hand did openly that he took her to be his wife promising through Divine Assistance to be unto her a true and loving husband until death should separate them. and then the said Mary Parker did in

like manner declare that she took Elijah Coleman to be her husband promising through Divine Assistance to be unto him a true and loving wife till death should separate them.

And as a further confirmation there of the said Elijah Coleman and Mary Coleman his now wife did to these presents set their hand. And we whose names are hereunto also subscribed being present at the solemnization of said marriage as witnesses there ^{unto} set our names the day and year above written
