

- Timothy Clare, immigrant ancestor of many of the Quaker families in Virginia and North Carolina, arrived in Maryland with Thomas Hassold and Thomas David in 1674, having at an earlier date sailed from Bristol, England, bound for the island of Nevis in the West Indies. By 1681, Timothy Clare removed to Albemarle, Berkeley precinct (later Perquimans county) NC. An analysis of wills, deeds, and an assignment of headrights indicates that Jane/Bogue/Moore/Loadman/Biers/Newby was the sister of Timothy Clare.

INTENTION TO MARRY IN CHURCH MARCH 6, 1685.

Timothy granted land on Perquimans River adjacent to William Bundy 23 Apr 1694 and 04 Feb 1713/14 and 15 Feb 1689 and land from Cabot and Jean Bundy 25 Feb 1692. Southside of the Narrows of Perquimans River in 1709

EARLY RECORDS OF NC Vol V, Wills 1723-36, p 20: Timothy CLEAR 10 Nov 1724, 17 Nov 1724, of Perquimans... gch John ROBINSON, son of Jos, 200 A. given him by his father is confirmed. Gch: John & Sarah ROBINSON.

WILL IN DEED BOOK E # 11 (WILL OF TIMOTHY CLEAR)

Sick & weak of body, but of sound mind & memory, do make this my last will, in manner as follows: To wife Hannah what was hers before I married her, one negro man named Sibbe, household goods, & furniture. To daughter Mary Mayo, 220a whereon I now live, the upper part thereof, where J Perry lives, and 200a next to John Winslow. To John Winslow plantation whereon his father & mother now live, after their decease. To son in law Thomas Winslow, 154a in Long Branch. To his two sons Timothy & Jesse, part of tract, adjacent their father. To Elizabeth Winslow, land back of John Winslow. To daughter Jane Jessup & husband Thomas, plantation in Old Neck, bought of my brother in law, William Bundy (brother of his first wife Mary Bundy) to daughter Sarah White, plantation whereon she now lives, on ye creek, and a tract on the river called "Passing Hall". To daughter Hephzibah Perry (thought to be step-daughter) land formerly Simpson's 200a whereon she now lives. To daughter Hannah (by third wife) plantation on Vosses Creek, on lower side of same, 200a bought of Thomas Harvey, and 130a at "Snodens Dock". To daughter Jane & son in law Thomas Jessup, 100a adjacent Stephen Gibson. To grandson John Robinson, land given him by his father Joseph Robinson, 200a on mill creek. To each daughter a negro, "ye meeting to value same out of remaining estate. My five children" Mary, Elizabeth, Jane, Sarah, and Hannah. Grandson & granddaughter John & Sarah Robinson 20 pounds. To grandson Thomas Winslow, my beaver hat. Exrs' son in laws Thomas Winslow & Thomas Jessup, probated Nov 10, 1724, before E Moseley. Test Thomas Bagley, Smith Cale

Timothy Clear, late of this province dec'd hath appointed Thomas Jessup and Thomas Winslow exrs of his will Nov 17, 1724. George Burington.

***John Winslow here mentioned, M Esther (Hester) Sme;omg (daughter of Israel & Hannah nee Laurence) who married second Timothy Clare, by whom she had one daughter Hannah, named in his will above. John Winslow was probably brother of Thomas, who m Elizabeth Clare, but no actual proof can be found. They were certainly contemporaries.

Thomas Winslow 5 April 1720 100 acres on the N.E. side of Perquimons River, joining Timothy Clare AND the desert.

PATENT BOOK THREE PAGE 260 #2599

John Winslow 9 November 1730, 200 acres in Perquimons Precinct, joining his own land, Timothy Winslow, John Hudson, and the N.E. side of the river.

On Apr 1702, court at the house of Captain James Coles:
At this court Thomas Winslow "proved on write for his freedom an assigned it to Timothy Clar". soon after this date he married Elizabeth Clare, daughter of Timothy and it seems certain he was apprentice to said Clare and had just come of age.

Timothy Cleare granted 173 acres on Perquimans River, adj. Wm Bundy dec'd April 25, 1694. TYMO. Clare granted 250 acres on Perquimans River, adj. land whereon he now lives on e side of SD River. Feb 4, 1713/14. He purchased of Patrick Kenedy a planation of Franks Creek, Feb 15, 1689. and another plantation at the head of Perquimons River, from Caleb and Jean Bundy, 25, 2 mo, 1692/3. His land appears to have been situated on the south west side of the Narrows of Perquimans River. Thomas Harvey of Perquimons sold to Timothy Clare 200 acres on "Upper Vosses Creek" Adj. John Morgan and Francis Toms. His land on north side of Perquimans was on Brambly Branch and was called "Round House Land" his name is variously spelled on the records in PERQ CO: Clare, Cleare, Clear, Clar, but it is each time the same person, as he is the only one of the name in the county and had no male descendants. The line became extinet when he died. He was purgess from Perq Oct 11, 1709 justice of peace (Col Records) Berkeley Parish Reg gives the date of his marriage as follows.

Timothy Cleare (ye son of Will Cleare) AND Mary Bundy (YE DAU OF William Bundy AND Elizabeth HIS WIFE) WEAARE MARIED YE 7 OF June 168..... and the Quaker records the same, with the date a little different: as follows "at a meeting at Joh's Phelps house, Timothy Cleare, declaring his intention of marriage with Mary Bundy (D OF William) 6, 3MO 1685. (date of intent and date of marriage are always different) [9]
