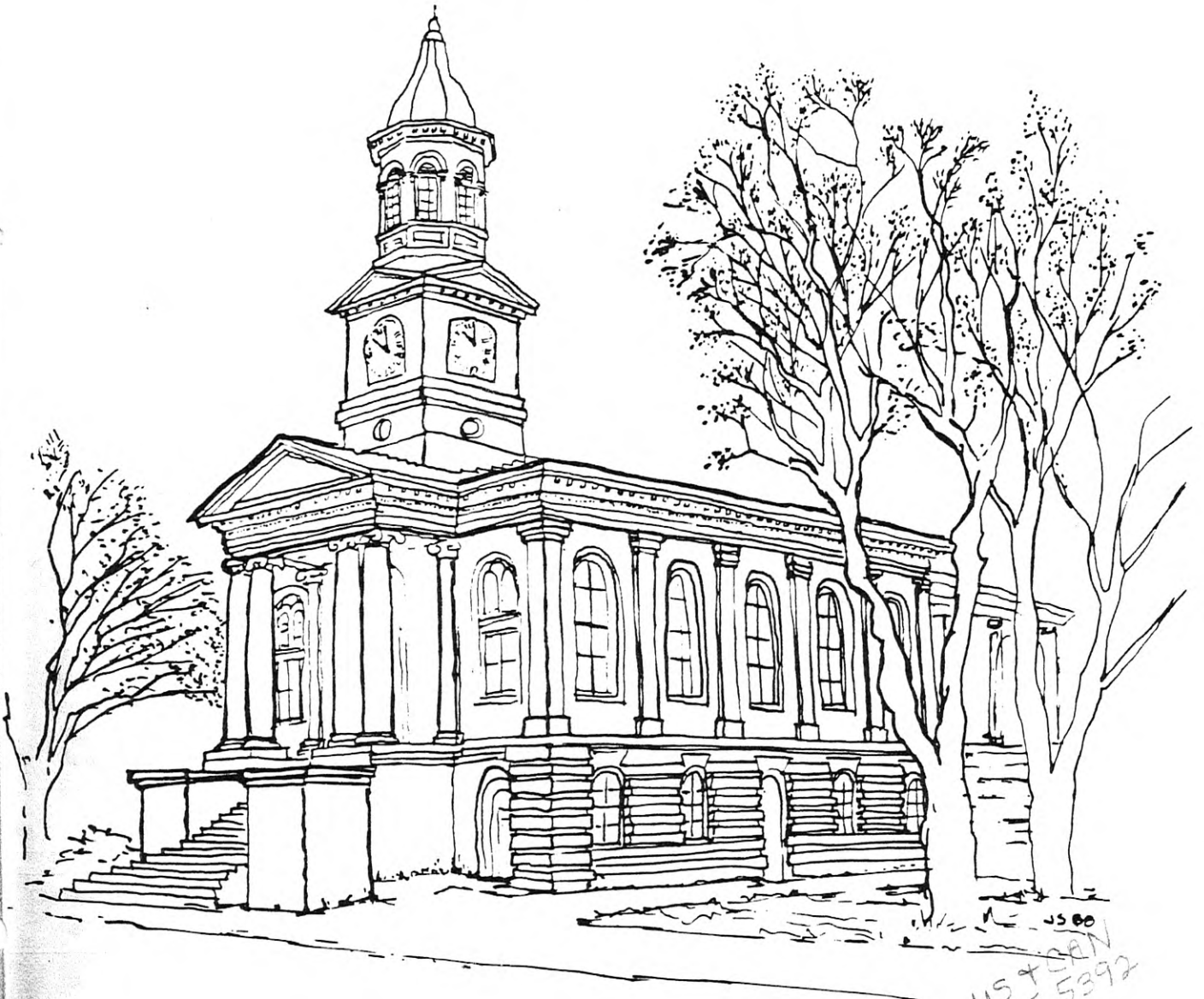

 one shilling and no more Item I give to my Sun ROBERT FOOLE my lot where I now live Item I
 give to my Son JOHN FOOLE one black mayer named Blase and my gun. I give to my Daughter SARAH
 Foole four pounds Ten shillings in BRUMLFIELD LONGs hands ur the mayer again that I sold him if
 she likes to back her again Item I give all the remainder of my Estate not before mentioned to be
 Equalle divided between my loving wife MAGRET LINES and my three children Robert Foole,
 Sarah Foole and John Foole after my debts and funeral expenses is payed I do apoynt my Sun Robert
 Foole and my Daughter Sarah Foole my Executors of this my last Will and Testament ..

 This Last Will and Testament of Robert Lines was proved by the oath of George Doggett a witness
 thereto And at a Court held for the sd County on Friday the 16th day of March 1749 the said Will
 was sworn to by the Executor ROBERT FOLEY therein named and ordered to be recorded and certifi-
 cate is granted to the said Robert Fooley for obtaining a Probat thereof in due form, Elizabeth
 Howell, Jemima Gannet and Mary Carter Coheirs at Law of the Decedent appear'd in Court and de-
 clared severally that they had no legal objections to the validity of this Will

pp In the Name of God Amen December 22d 1746 I THOMAS WATTS of St. Thomas's Parish in
 10- Culpeper County Planter being in sound and Parfect Health of mind and memory .. and as
 14 touching such woridly Estate .. I hereby make my last Will and Testament .. Imprimis I
 give and bequeath my Soul to Almighty God that gave it me and my Body to the Earth to be
 buried Item I will and desire that my wellbeloved Wife ESTHER shall live on the plantation I now
 live on if she be the longest liver and have One hundred acres adjoining with Timber and Wood for

 WATTS so up the great branch including the land between them Bounds and BLAND BALLARDS line
 Estimated Two hundred acres more or less .. Item I give to my son THOMAS WATTS the Plantation
 known by the name of JOHN STONES Plantation with the tract of land adjoining thereunto conta-
 ning by Estimation One hundred eighty three acres be the same more or less and bounded on Bland
 Ballards line James Barbour's line and DIXON's line .. Item I give and bequeath to my son JACOB
 WATTS a Tract of land containing by Estimation One hundred and fifty acres be the same more or
 less and bounded between Bland Ballards, Benja. Watts .. Item I give to my Daughter SARAH WATTS
 a tract of land containing by Estimation One hundred and fifty acres be the same more or less
 bounded between James Barbour, JOSEPH ROGERS, Dixon's line .. Item I give and bequeath after
 my Decease and the Decease or day of Marriage of my Wife Esther the abovementioned plantation I
 now live on with One hundred acres of land thereunto adjoining and bounded on the River and run-

pp. In the Name of God Amen. The Last Will and Testament of JOHN BOND of Culpeper County
 220- being now at this time in perfect halth & soundness of mind and memory as followeth Viz.
 221 Imprimis I recommend my soul to God Almighty .. Item I deliver up my body to the Earth
 whence it came. Item after all my Just debts & funerall charges are paid I desire the re-
 mainder of my Estate to be disposed of as followeth Viz. I desire my beloved Wife MARY & my Son
 in Law BENJAMIN be & take upon them to be Executrix & Exr. of this my last Will and Testament.
 Item I leave my beloved Wife Mary my whole Estate during her life (only as is heretofore
 reserved) but if she should intermarry with any other person that then my estate shall be taken
 out of her hands reserving her thirds & the other two parts to be given to my Daughter MARY LONG
 .. Item I desire the Plantation whereon I now live to be my dearly beloved wife Mary during her
 life & afterwards to my daughter Mary .. Item I give to my grandson JOHN BOND LONG sone of
 BLOOMFIELD LONG and ELIZABETH his Wife my bed and furniture whereon I now lie but not to be
 delivered till the said John Bond Long comes of age. Item I give and bequeath to my grandson
 BLOOMFIELD LONG sone of BENJAMIN LONG & Mary his Wife my rifle gun but not till the said
 Bloomfield Long comes of age. Item after the death of my beloved wife Mary Bond my desire is that
 my whole Personal Estate & all the goods & chattels that she is then possessed of shall be given to

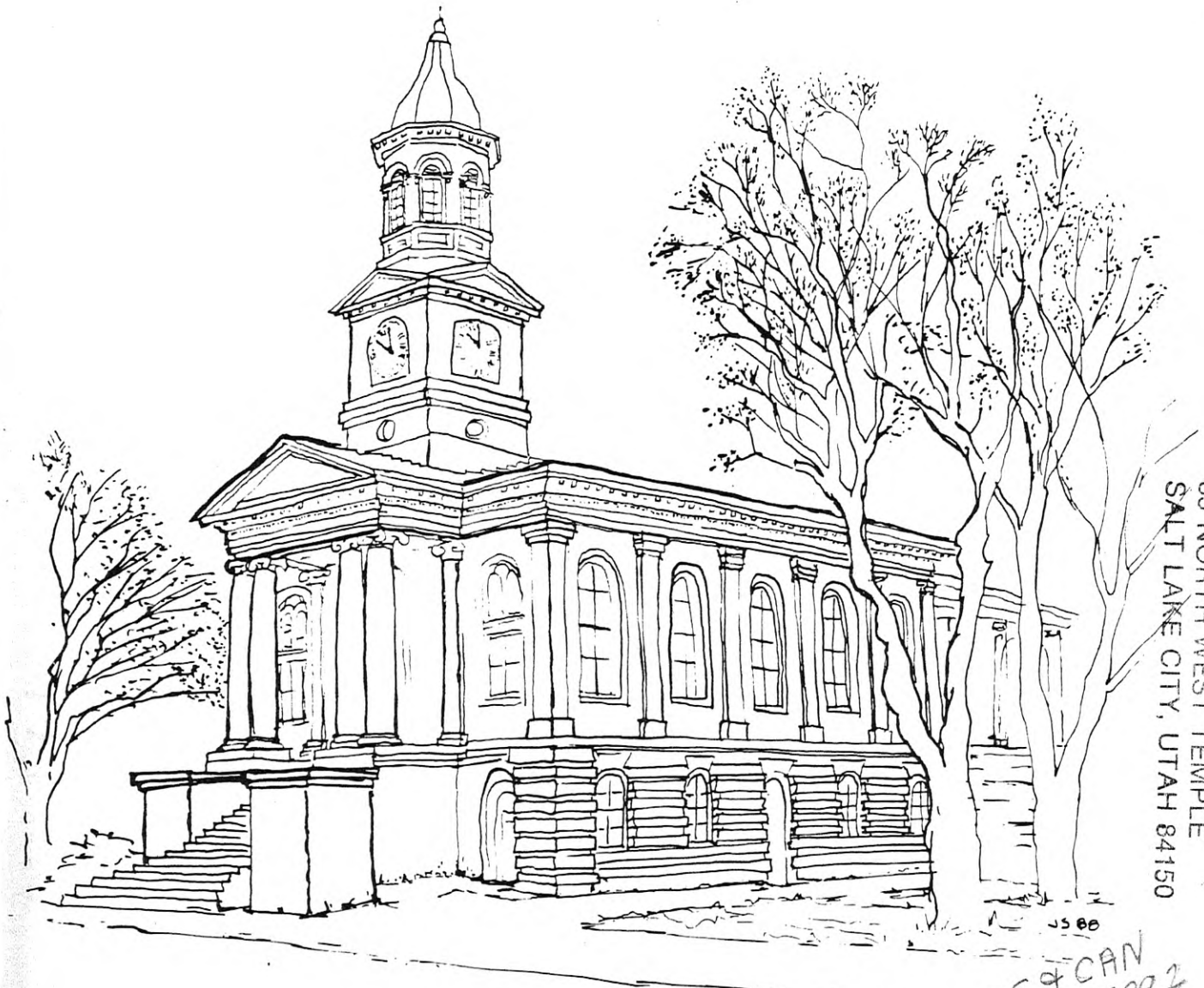
