The condition of the above bound is such that whereas
 James Diver claims a part of the negroes belonging to
 Reuben Daniel, dec'd, by marrying his daughter, that is
 the negroes that Reuben Daniel recovered by law in pos-
 session which came by his wife, Penny, and mother of Ro-
 bert Daniel, Molly Segar and Betty Diver, now wife of
 the above Diver. Now know ye that the above Conner &
 Daniel have agreed to give the said Diver, in considera-
 tion of his claim, a negro boy named Major .. and the
 said Diver .. do agree to acquit and discharge the sd
 Conner & Daniel .. forever from all claims, demands,
 controversies, law suits, whatever relating to the afore-
 said negroes, then the above bound to be voided, other-
 wise to remain in full force and virtue.

- 3. Ordered that Wm. Wright, Adam Lindsay, Henry Wood & John Bledsoe, or any three of them, do appraise the estate of Thomas Foster, dec'd, and make return to the court of the same.
- 4. Edmd. Terrell appointed guardian to Robt., James, Nancy, Fanny & Lucy Terrell, orphans of Edmd. Terrell, dec'd, whereupon he with Joseph Clark & Reuben Rucker entered into bond for the same in the sum of £ 500.
- 5. At a court held for Orange County on Tuesday the 26th day of April 1791 On the examination of James Douglass, alias Jno. Johnson, who stands committed to the gaol of this county charged with feloniously entering the dwelling house of Thomas Barbour, Gent., & stealing from thence one feather bed and sundry furniture thereunto belonging of the value of £ 10 C. money. The above named James Douglass, alias Jno. Johnson, was led to the barr & plead not guilty. Several witnesses were examined on the premises and the prisoner heard in his defence. The court are of the opinion that he is guilty of the sd felony and ought to be tryed for the same in the next District Court to be held at Fred'burg Whereupon he is remanded to the gaol of this county & to be sent accordingly.

Lewis Lindsay (executor of Caleb Lindsay, dec'd) of the county of Orange .. and Sarah Lindsay of same .. Witnesseth that .. Lewis Lindsay .. sum of \$381.00 .. sell and deliver .. Sarah Lindsay .. one certain tract or parcel of land containing by survey 95 1/2 acres, being the same tract that belonged to the late Caleb Lindsay and bounded as follows, to wit. Beginning at a hickory, corner to Wisdom Atkins .. meanders of the road .. Jacob Graves .. James Daniel .. to the beginning.

-204. Ordered that William Stevens, Thomas Coleman, James Nelson and Landon Lindsay, or any three, do examine, state and settle James Chiles' administration account of the estate of Thomas Chiles, deceased, and that they make report thereof to the court.

-205. William Stevens, excor of John Stevens Snr., dec'd, against Lancelot Burrus, Landon Lindsay and James B. Daniel \$1013.52 from 24 November 1828. Executed on two negroes, Harvey and Sarah, in the possession of the deft., Landon Lindsay, which were sold at Orange court-house on the 22 June 1827 for the sum of three hundred and fifty dollars, and the balance of the execution was paid by the deft., Burrus, which sums satisfy the execution.

Elizabeth Brockman Bronaugh married 2nd Joseph Mason who died in Christian County, Kentucky 1826 or 1827. Their children were William B; Charles B., Mary Jane; Tandy B., and Elizabeth A.

110. The will of John Durrett probated 16 February 1775 in Spotsylvania County. Son in law James Wiglesworth is named executor. The legatees named are son, Richard Durrett, daughter, Ann Long and her children: Elizabeth, Agatha, Ann, Cathren and Susannah Long; grandson, Bromfield Long; granddaughter, Mary Skelton; daughter, Elizabeth Chiles and her children, Elizabeth, Harry and James Chiles. Her husband was James Chiles.
111. Eleanor Woolfolk, daughter of Christo Brockman (mother) married Edward Spencer 7 November 1787. John Oakes signed consent for Eleanor, Joseph Woolfolk was surety and Samuel Brockman was witness. (Orange County Marriage Register 1.)
112. Bernard Moore married Catey Price 3 October 1770 (Orange County Marriage Register 1, p. 2.)
113. John Stevens Junr. was the son of ancestral John and Sarah Mountague Stevens. Mary Smith was the daughter of William and Ann Stevens Bowker Smith. Their children:
1. Ann Smith Stevens was born before 1792 and married John Stevens, called the "Younger" or "Minor."
 2. Sarah Mountague Stevens was born about 1800 and married William McCaffrey 28 January 1819 in Clark County, Kentucky. He died about 1832 and she married second Edward W. Stuart in 1833. He was born in Kentucky about 1806.
- John and Mary Smith Stevens were separated 19 October 1815. She moved to Clark County, Kentucky with their two daughters.
