Declaration

In order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress,
passed June 7th 1852,

State of North Carolina

Beake County 3rd On this 11th day of July one thousand

eight hundred and forty four, I personally appeared
before me William B. Hunt one of the acting Registrars and
a minister of the Court of Pleas and Sessions, in and
for said County, John Gibbs a resident of the County and
State aforesaid aged eighty nine years who being first
duly sworn according to Law both on his oath make the
following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the
act of Congress passed June 7th 1852,

That in the days of the Revolution he resided
in Beake County North Carolina, and entered the service of the
United States under the following named officers, and served
in several States. That in the year 1786, he was drafted into
the service for a term of three months under Captains Black
who marched his company from Beake on to Charlotte where
they joined General Davidson, who was stationed in Archden
Cur County, and that after staying some weeks at that Post
they were joined by General Morgan who spent a few days
with them, and then the army parted and declarant was
placed under General Morgan who marched on to North
Carolina to the Camp at which Post he declarant was dis-
charged having served out his term of duty.

The next term of duty was in the summer of the year
following in the year 1786, he was again called into the service
to serve another three months term under Captain John Conley
by order of Colonel Milledenell, and was ordered on to the Post
at the head of the Catawba River, where he did most service
out his term of duty and was discharged.

This deponent further states that he performed other services
but the above is the only regular term that he was out. He also
states that he has no documentary evidence in support of his
services, but that he can prove a part or all his services by
Paroll evidence

This declarant also stated that his name is not on
the Pension Roll of any agency of any State that he hereby
disclaims every claim whatever to a Pension except the
present, and that the reason why he has not applied before
this late day for his Pension is that he was disappointed
by an agent that he had employed, and who amount was
so small that he thought to live without it and it is now
from actual necessity he is induced to apply for a Pension,
I know to and subscribed on the day and year first above

hath this day sworn to and subscribed the foregoing decla-
ration before me is a Minister of the Gospel, a person to whose
statements is due full faith and credit.

I also certify that he is known and reputed in his
neighborhood to have been a Soldier in the Revolution and
that I fully concur in that opinion, and that I believe him to
be of the age as set forth, and to have served as above stated.

I do further certify that John Gibbs the declarant
is by reason of old age and bodily infirmity, unable to go
to Court to make his declaration.
