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HOLLINGSWORTH, THOMAS. Oath of Allegiance in 1778 (A-7).

HOLLINGSWORTH, ZEBULON (May 17, 1735 - March 24, 1812). He married Mary Evans on June 22, 1764 and they had these children: Levi (born 1765, married Ann Dorsey); Peggy (born 1766, married William Cooch); Robert (born 1768, married Jeanne Talandier); William (died young); James (died young); John (born 1774); William (born 1780, married Mary Eliza); and, Evans. (U-395). Zebulon took Oath of Allegiance in 1778 (A-15), and in 1780 he gave 285 barrels of flour to be delivered at the Head of Elk (U-395). His brother was Col. Henry Hollingsworth (C-14).

HOLMS, ABRAHAM. Private in Capt. W. Alexander's Company, 30th Battalion, enrolled July 24, 1776 (C-86, G-62).

HOLT, GEORGE. Oath of Allegiance in 1778 (A-14). George Holt married Catherine Price, daughter of William Price, on June 6, 1763 (R-89).

HOLT, ISAAC. Oath of Allegiance in 1778 (A-8).

HOLTHAM, JOSEPH. Oath of Allegiance in 1778 (A-4). "Joseph Haltham" was a Private in Capt. Joshua George's Company, 18th Battalion, August 18, 1776 (C-84, G-61).

HOLTHAM, SPENCER. Oath of Allegiance in 1778 (A-4). Spencer "Hottham" married Elizabeth Morrison on November 13, 1788 (O-10).

HOMES, GEORGE. Oath of Allegiance in 1778 (A-7).

HONEYMAN, ROBERT. Oath of Allegiance in 1778 (A-16).

HOOPER, ABRAHAM. Oath of Allegiance in 1778 (A-4).

HOOPER, ISAAC. Oath of Allegiance in 1778 (A-17).

HOPKINS, JOHN. Oath of Allegiance in 1778 (A-15).

HOUSLY, JOHN. Private in Capt. Henry Dobson's Company in the 6th Maryland Line, in N. C. in October, 1780 (G-348).

~~HOWARD, JOHN.~~ Private in Col. Harry Lee's Partisan Cavalry, April 1, 1778 through December, 1780 (G-587).

HOWELL (HOWEL), JAMES. Oath of Allegiance in 1778 (A-5).

HOWELL (HOWEL), WILLIAM. Oath of Allegiance in 1778 (A-5). William "Howell," son of George and Mary Howell, both from County Cork, Ireland, married Ruth Smith, daughter of William and Sarah Smith, on November 9, 1755 (R-92).

HOWLAND (NOWLAND), ALIAS. Oath of Allegiance, 1778 (A-17).

HOWLAND (NOWLAND), RICHARD. Oath of Allegiance, 1778 (A-17).

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Lieutenant on June 22, 1778 (E-56).

HOGANS, WILLIAM. Oath of Allegiance in 1778 (A-4).

HOLLAND (HALLON), JACOB. Oath of Allegiance in 1778 (A-11).

HOLLAND (HOLLAN), JOHN. Oath of Allegiance in 1778 (A-2).

HOLLAND, JNO. Oath of Allegiance in 1778 (A-17).

HOLLIDAY, JOHN JR. Private in Capt. Henry Dobson's Company in the 6th Maryland Line, 1780 (G-348). John "Holladay" married Rebecca Simpers by license January 3, 1788 (O-9).

HOLLINGS, JONATHAN. Oath of Allegiance in 1778 (A-14).

HOLLINGSWORTH, GEORGE. Oath of Allegiance in 1778 (A-15).

HOLLINGSWORTH, HENRY. (September 17, 1737 - September 29, 1803), a son of Zebulon Hollingsworth and Ann Maulden. He married first to Sarah Husband and had two children: Polly (born 1771, married first John Gilpin and second Fresby Henderson), and William (born 1773, married Ann Black). He married second to Jane Evans by license dated February 12, 1778 and had four children: Hannah (married James Partridge), Betsy; Nancy (married John Tally); and, Henry (V-138, O-1). He began his military career in 1775 with the first company raised in Cecil County. On Feb. 6, 1776 he made an agreement with the Council of Safety to carry on a saltpetre works and to manufacture gun barrels and bayonets for the Maryland troops at his forge on Big Elk River (I-24, K-38, P-138). He was Lieutenant Colonel and Adjutant in the Elk (2nd) Battalion on Jan. 6, 1776 (I-36, J-323), and a Colonel (S-MdHR6636-9-93), when severely wounded in the throat prior to the Battle of Brandywine in 1777 (I-60, I-64, K-78). Retired from active service, he became Quartermaster or Commissioner (Supply Agent) for the Eastern Shore and part of Harford Co. (K-18) and subsequently Deputy Quartermaster General (I-174, I-211). He also shipped supplies to Valley Forge, on Feb. 19, 1778 (L-23) and served on several committees in Cecil County including one that issued Bills of Credit and paper money for the State in 1781 (C-12, C-13, C-14, C-87). He took the Oath of Allegiance in 1778 (A-15). He died September 29, 1803. Reinterred in Elkton Cemetery.

HOLLINGSWORTH, JACOB. Oath of Allegiance in 1778 (A-7). 2nd Lieutenant in Capt. Jonathan Booth's Company, in the Elk Battalion, 1777-1778 (E-55, S-MdHR6636-9-93). Jacob's brother was Col. Henry Hollingsworth (C-14).

HOLLINGSWORTH, JAMES. Oath of Allegiance in 1778 (A-15).

HOLLINGSWORTH, SAMUEL. Acting Commissary of Issues (Head of Elk) in 1778 (I-182). Oath of Allegiance in 1778 (A-7).

HOLLINGSWORTH, STEPHEN. Oath of Allegiance in 1778 (A-7).

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
