evidence. [Beetle appeared in November, but the other two did not; ordered again to appear by the vestry. Thomas Beetle and Sylvia Jones appeared in December and were admonished by Rev. Hamilton and the matter to be dealt with according to law in March Court. They failed to appear and by September, 1766, still had not appeared]. Samuel Faris and Elizabeth White ordered to show cause why they unlawfully lived together and not being married (November, 1765) and Robert Nesbitt ordered to appear as evidence (in March, 1766). [They appeared and were reported married]. John Magruder and Elizabeth Jackson ordered to show cause why they unlawfully cohabit together (November, 1765) in March, 1766. [Subsequently reported that "John Magrager is gone out of the county"]. Charles Brookins and Margaret Gordon ordered to appear to show cause why they unlawfully cohabited together and do not marry (September, 1766). Jacob Johnson and Rebecca Hewkin ordered to appear as to why they are cohabiting and not married (September, 1766). James Wareham and Sabina McDowell (widow) ordered to appear as to why they cohabit unlawfully (June 1767). [They appeared in August and were admonished by Rev. Hamilton]. Mordecai Cloud and Elizabeth Connolly ordered to show cause why they cohabit unlawfully (October, 1767). Alexander Butler and Hester Hughes ordered to show cause why they cohabit unlawfully (October, 1767). Edward Bryan and Lydia Wells ordered to show cause why they cohabit unlawfully (August, 1768). [They appeared and were admonished by Rev. Hamilton and the vestry]. Edward Wellden and Mary Campbell ordered to show cause why they cohabit unlawfully (October, 1768). James Orrick produced the following certificate of marriage: "These are to certify all concerned that Mr. James Orrick and Miss Eve Baker were some considerable time agoe married by me by virtue of a license from his Excellency Robert Eden Governor of Maryland. Given under my hand this September 2, 1770. Signed, John Beard" (presented to the vestry September 4, 1770). Edward McVinish (McVinchie) and Sarah Noland (Nowidham) ordered to appear to show cause why they cohabit unlawfully (April, 1771). [They appeared in August and were admonished by Rev. Hamilton and desired to separate by the vestry]. Samuel Logan and Jane Bing were ordered to appear regarding their unlawful cohabitation, but were reported to have left the county (June, 1771). William McCullough and Susannah Connolly were ordered to appear regarding their unlawful cohabitation (December, 1774).

UNLAWFUL COHABITATIONS IN ST. MARY ANN'S P.E. PARISH, 1749-1776

John Key (Keyes) and Mary Skurry (Scurry) ordered to appear before the Vestry to show cause why they are unlawfully cohabiting together (May, 1749). [He appeared in May, 1750 and was admonished by Rev. Hugh Jones. She did not appear. Later, John Keyes and Mary Scurry, wife of Thomas Scurry, did appear and both were legally admonished in November, 1751. In March, 1752 they were still unlawfully cohabiting together]. John Howard and Alice Walley were ordered to appear before the Vestry on suspicion of unlawfully cohabiting (July, 1750). Alexander McIntosh and Alice Howard were ordered to appear before the Vestry for unlawfully cohabiting together (December, 1752) and George Thornberry was summoned as evidence. [Neither appeared but George said he had seen them in bed together in January, 1753]. Thomas Beetle and Sylvia Jones ordered to appear to show cause why they unlawfully cohabit together, and Ann Crouch to appear as

UNLAWFUL COHABITATIONS IN ST. MARY ANN'S P.E. PARISH, AUGUST, 1756: Lewis Lee and Rebecca Childs -- both appeared and were strictly admonished by Rev. Thomas Thornton. [They were still cohabitating together unlawfully in March, 1757]. Charles Ragon and the Widow Death -- both appeared and produced a certificate signed by Mr. William Lindsay, Minister living in Pennsylvania. John Gardener and Ann Hughey....[nothing further recorded].

UNLAWFUL COHABITATIONS IN ST. MARY ANN'S P.E. PARISH, MARCH 5, 1759: Jonas Cooper of Charles Town, cordwainer, and Elizabeth Jackson ordered to appear, but Rev. John Hamilton informed the vestry that he has since married them. Walter Rodgers and Martha his supposed wife ordered to appear, but Rev. John Hamilton informed the vestry that they were married.
