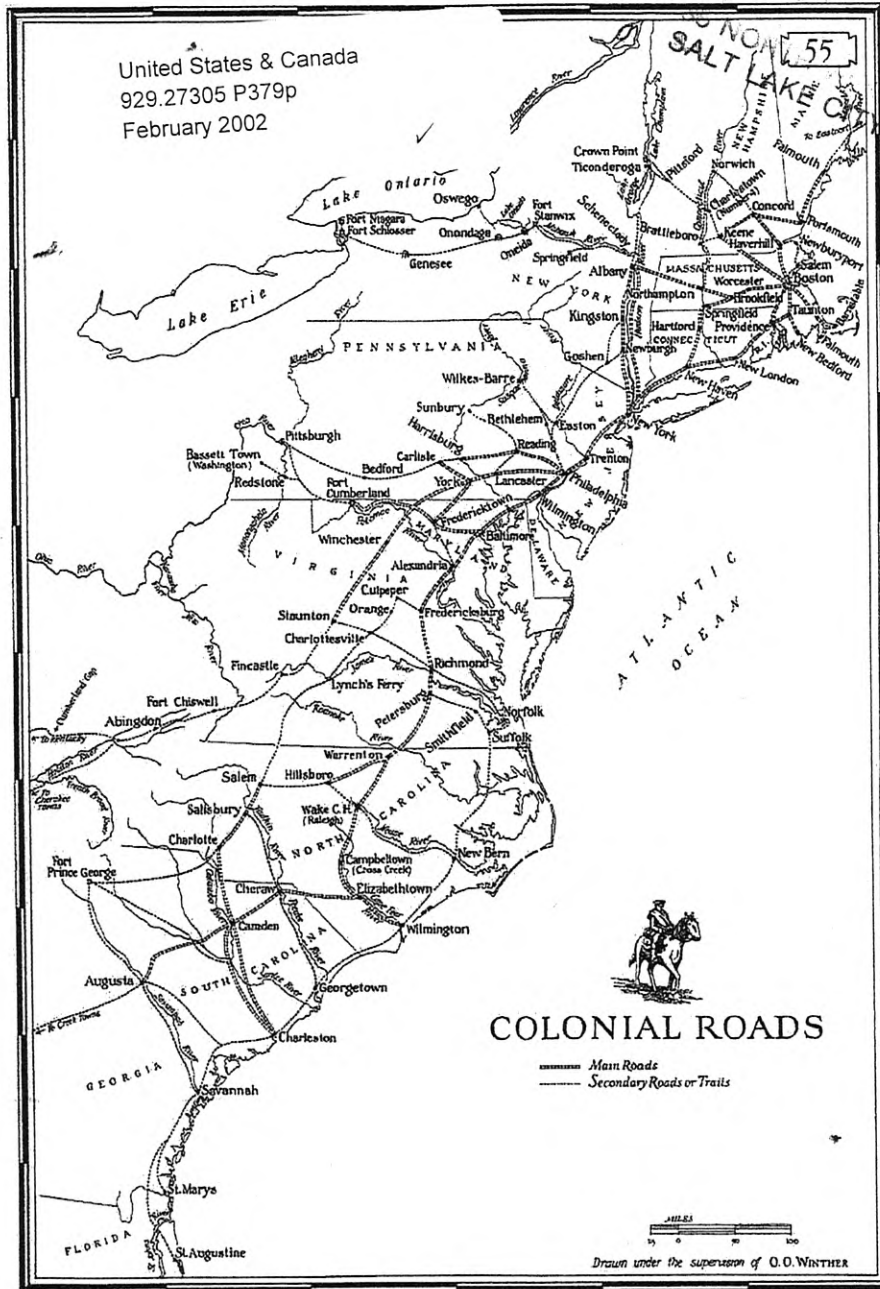

CARL PENLAND, was raised on a farm near Pleasant Lake, Steuben County, Indiana. He is the son of William and Erma (Rohm) Penland, who lived on the east side in Pleasant Lake and are both farmers. Erma's ancestors appear in the earlier history books. Carl had the Penland family traced and his brothers came to America from Preble County, Ohio. Carl was the first man to get married in the church near Waterloo. After the marriage and Ann moved to Auburn. (Carl's father) Ellert. Paternal grandparents were Frank and Erma near Waterloo.

Marriage Records

KNOW all Men by these Presents, That we William Penland of St Georges Hundred and John Rankins of Newcastle Hundred both in the County of Newcastle on Delaware

are firmly bound unto the Honourable JAMES HAMILTON, Esq; Lieutenant Governor and Commander in Chief of the Province of Pennsylvania, and Counties of New Castle, Kent and Sussex on Delaware, in the Sum of Three Hundred Pounds, good and lawful Money of America, to be paid to the said JAMES HAMILTON, Esq; his certain Attorney, Executors Administrators, or Assigns: To the which Payment well and truly to be made, WE bind ourselves jointly and severally, for and in the Whole, our Heirs, Executors and Administrators, firmly by these Presents Sealed with our Seals, dated the Second Day of June in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty two

THE Condition of this Obligation is

such: That if there shall not hereafter appear any lawful Let or Impediment, by Reason of any Pre-Contract, Consanguinity, Affinity, or any other just Cause whatsoever; but that the above-mentioned, William Penland and Annis Donnal of New London Township in Chester County Single Woman

may lawfully marry; and that there is not any Suit depending before any Judge Ecclesiastical or Civil, for or concerning any such Pre-Contract: and do and shall save harmless and keep indemnified the above named JAMES HAMILTON Esq; his Heirs, Executors, and Administrators, for and concerning the Premises: Then this Obligation to be void and of none Effect; or else to stand and remain in full Force and Virtue,
