

Know all men by these presents that we Jed
 Smith and Clark Woodruff of Wil-
 kinson County and Mississippi Territory
 are held and firmly bound unto the Governor
 of the said Territory and his successors in office
 for the use of the said Territory, in the sum of
 two hundred dollars, good and lawful money
 of the United States for the use of the said
 Territory for which payment well and truly
 to be made we bind ourselves, our and each of
 our Heirs Executors and Administrators, sev-
 erally, jointly by these presents. Sealed with
 our seals and dated this 25th day of October
 1816.

The condition of the above obligation is such
 that whereas the above bound Jed Smith
 hath this day of the date here of prayed
 and obtained a licence to join in Marriage
 to Mary Ann Gray of said County.
 Now if there be no lawful cause to obstruct the
 Marriage for which the said licence hath
 been granted, then and in that case the above
 obligation to be void, otherwise to be and re-
 main in full force and virtue.
