

# Hold-Up Artist Captured After Wild Chase in City

## Glancing Bullet Enters Residence On South Main

Not since the early 1930's when such notorious badmen as "Pretty Boy" Floyd, Matt and George Kimes, Wilbur Underhill, Glen Roy Wright and others terrorized Oklahoma has Payne, Noble and Pawnee county officers encountered anyone like the 19-year-old youngster who hijacked a Perry service station early this morning.

"He's got more 'guts' than anybody I've ever jumped," Trooper E. H. Gay said.

He and Lt. Ira Honeyman of the Stillwater police department exchanged bullets with the fuzzy-cheeked Nebraskan while whizzing down Stillwater's Main street and North on SH-40 at 99-miles-per-hour.

Gay emptied 20-rounds at the fleeing youngster and Lt. Honeyman probably fired the same number. Two bullets riddled the license tag of the burned -uo car Nagle was driving, several others glanced off the trunk of the car and several found their way into the rear glass.

### Drives on Rims

After Trooper Gay and Lt. Honeyman flushed Nagle out of a filling station at 13th and Main they chasing him north on SH-40. Finally, they got close enough to put one of the bullets in the right rear of the.

Nagle, despite constant weaving, continued to herd the car down the highway until the rubber scattered all over the road. This didn't stop Nagle either. He turned the car off on a dirt road at the county line and kept travelling on the rim.

"The way he handled that car at that high rate of speed Nagle could make a prosperous living driving a racer," Gas asserted.

Although the gun battle down Stillwater's Main "drag" didn't awaken many people, it left its effects.

One of the bullets which ricocheted off one of the automobiles dug its way into a house at 121 S. Main.

### Finds Plaster

The bullet ripped through the south side of the house into the front room and dug into the wall paper on the south side of the room.

It just missed damaging some expensive ceramic pieces valued at several hundred dollars.

Mrs. Max Perkins, who is operating the Feepee Ceramic Studio in the absence of Mrs. Peggy Quackembush who's on vacation in New Mexico this summer, said she found plaster on the floor when she came to work this morning and thought someone had bored a big hole in the wall.

## Nebraska Youth Shoots Attendant At Perry Station

A bold young hold-up man with "guts to spare" was arrested at 8:20 a.m. following a six-hour hunt involving more than 200 troopers and sheriff's officers from three counties.

Supposedly on "vacation" from Omaha, Neb., 19-year-old Reinhardt Adolph Nagle surrendered meekly to troopers Taylor Lain and Charles Wood of Ponca City seven miles north and five miles west of Stillwater exactly six hours after he had abandoned a stolen 1949 model car, riddled by bullets.

Trooper Eual Gay and Lt. Ira Honeyman of the Stillwater police department jumped young Nagle seven miles west on SH 51 at 1:25 a.m. following a call from Perry that he had robbed and wounded Charles Wortham, 62, a service station attendant. The attendant was reported recovering.

When Trooper Gay spotted the car it was traveling approximately 90 miles per hour. By the time Gay turned his car around Nagle was out of sight.
