The Condition of this Obligation is such, That if the above bounden

Administrators of all and singular the Goods, Chattles, Credits, and Estate of
Samuel Humilton late of Hamden deceased

do make, or cause to be made, a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the
Goods, Chattles, Credits, and Estate of the said deceased, which have or shall come
to the Hands, Possession, or Knowledge of the said Administrators or into the Hands,
or Possession, of any other Person, or Persons, for them and the same so made, do ex-
hibit, or cause to be exhibited, into the Registry of the said Court of Probate, at or
before the *5th* Day of *July* next ensuing. And the said
Goods, Chattles, Credits, and Estate; and all other the Goods, Chattles, Credits, and
Estate of the said deceased, at the Time of his Death, which at any Time after
shall come into the Hands or Possession of the said Administrators or into the
Hands or Possession of any other Person or Persons, for them do well and truly
administer according to law. And furthermore, Do make or cause to be made, a true
and just Account of their said Administration, at or before the *5th* Day of
June which will be A. D. 1799

And all the Rest, and Residue, of the said Goods, Chattles, Credits, and Estate, which
