Hands, and sealed with our Seals. Dated at New Haven the 8th Day of June
A.D. 1798.*

The Condition of this Obligation is such, That if the above bounden

*Administrator of all and singular the Goods, Chattles, Credits, and Estate of
Samuel Hamilton late of Hamden deceased
do make, or cause to be made, a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the
Goods, Chattles, Credits, and Estate of the said deceased, which have or shall come
to the Hands, Possession, or Knowledge of the said Administrator or into the Hands,
or Possession, of any other Person, or Persons, for ~~them~~ and the same so made, do ex-
hibit, or cause to be exhibited, into the Registry of the said Court of Probate, at or
before the 8th Day of July next ensuing. And the said
Goods, Chattles, Credits, and Estate : and all other the Goods, Chattles, Credits, and
Estate of the said deceased, at the Time of his Death, which at any Time after
shall come into the Hands or Possession of the said Administrator or into the
Hands or Possession of any other Person or Persons, for ~~them~~ do well and truly
administer according to law. And furthermore, Do make or cause to be made, a true
and just Account of ~~their~~ said Administration, at or before the 8th Day of
June 1799 which will be A. D. 1799 And all
