The next year, 1800, came Joel Humason, Isaac Humason, Simeon Wheeler, Seth Bartholomew, and Sylvester Woodford. They all came from Connecticut by the way of Pittsburg with ox teams and the old Yankee ox cart, cutting their road most of the way from Youngstown to Vienna through the woods. Joel and Isaac Humason settled on the farms now owned by George Patterson and Henry Fowler, Simon Wheeler settled on the farm now owned by I. B. Payne, and Woodford on the farm now owned by George Chamberlain, and Bartholomew settled south of the center, near J. Woodford's.

Brent, you have certainly done a lot of work and you present it in an interesting way which I've not seen before. I had a little trouble following/finding the generations since they are not numbered but none the less, you have been busy.

My Humiston interests as you may have noted are with the family members that removed from CT to Vienna Township, Trumbull County, OH. This probably included all or most of the sons and daughters of Daniel and Desire (Dorman) Humiston. I did not find Mary Humiston married to Ebenezer Newell Combs in your genealogy. I could not find Mary in your tree, but perhaps she was there and I couldn't identify the correct generation.

Notes: Jacob Humason was born on 17 Oct 1763 or 65 in New Haven, CT; m. Honore Hubbard, 1 Sep 1791 in Glastonbury, CT:

Moved soon afterward in to Ohio, along with his brother Joel. Jacob settled on the road leading from north to south through the township (Vienna), also the road leading east from the center of Yankee Run along with Henry H. Gandy, Walter Clark, Collins Youngs, Henry Reidsilly, Jacob Harris, Amos and Charles Bradford, John Woods, Joe Patic, Isaac Flower, and Ebenezer Combs. Isaac Flower settled on the Northwest corner of the center where he opened the first store at the enter. Jacob Hummason settled on the southwest corner at the center. [History of Trumbull and Mahoning Counties, Vol II, 1882, p. 348] Jacob was assigned to the same road district in Brookfield, Trumbull Co.,OH in 1811 as his neighbor, Ebenezer Combs, the wife of his niece, Mary Humiston Combs. They (Jacob and Honor) had 6 children, Henrietta, Leonard Hubbard, Maria, Mary, James, Julius, and Lawrence Stern. Jacob died on 8 Mar 1819 in Brookfield, Trumbull Co., OH "[of note is that Jacob was the ancestor of both the grandparents of Leo Humason, i.e., Lewis A. Humason (via Lawrence S. Humason) and of his wife Ellen A. Humason (via Leonard Hubbard Humason and his son John Sykes Humason, Ellen's father]"

Notes for Honore Hubbard: Honor had been born between 1754 and 1780 est. Honor was the daughter of Elizur Hubbard and his wife Lois Wright. Elizur Hubbard (1736-1818) commanded a company at the Lexington Alarm. He was born in Galastonbury and died there. He served in the militia when Tryon invaded the State.
