He left as heirs his widow Nancy Faucett who was administratrix of his estate, and children: William Faucett, Samuel Faucett, Mary Vaughan wife of James Vaughan, Nancy Hall wife of Samuel T. (or F.) Hall, Jane Palmer wife of Joshua Palmer, Richard Faucett (Jr.), and Elizabeth Page. In 1851 the daughter Elizabeth Page filed suit in Equity Court, Bill No. 375, for the division of the land belonging to the estate, 248 acs. on Brown's Creek, bound by John Giles, Est. of John Gist, John Davis, and Mary Porter. By 1851, the widow Nancy Faucett had died in 1848; the son Richard Faucett, Jr. had died leaving his widow Catherine Faucett and children Richard, Samuel, Elizabeth, and Catharine B. Faucett and Ann Faucett Springer wife of (blank) Springer, all of whom lived out of the State of S. C.. In Feb. 1851 Samuel Hall and wife Nancy were living in Tuscaloosa Co., Ala.. Others living out of the State of S. C. were William Faucett, James and Mary Vaughan, Joshua and Jane Palmer. William Faucett owed a debt to Thomas G. Page since 1821 and Thomas G.
