 the said John Bird before the sealing and delivery of
 these presents the receipt and payment hereof is
 truly acknowledged by the said Robert Gilham
 he hath given granted bargained sold aliened enfeoff
 conveyed and confirmed and by these presents doth
 give grant bargain sell alien enfeoff convey and
 confirm unto him the said John Bird his heirs and
 assigns forever a tract of land situate lying and
 being in South Carolina on the south side of Broad
 river and the north side of Pelkies Creek and was granted
 from North Carolina to Patrick Roberson and bears
 date from the eighteenth day of May in the year of our
 Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy one
 and was conveyed to J. Gilham by the said Patrick
 Roberson by the way of his will at his decease, and the
 lands to contain two hundred and fifty acres more
 or less and has such shape and marks as well
 appear by the original Plat, to wit beginning at
 a small black oak between a large Poplar and Chestnut
 and runs N. 20° West to a black oak thence W. 90° E
 to a stake thence S. 20° West to a stake thence to the
 Beginning together with all the rights title Interest
 Claim and Demand of him the said Robert Gilham
 to him the said John Bird his heirs and assigns forever
 to the only proper use benefit and behoof of him the
 said John Bird his heirs and assigns forever to have and to
 hold the said two hundred and fifty acres of land to him
 the said John Bird his heirs and assigns forever &
 he the said Robert Gilham for himself his Heirs
 Executors and Administrators doth for ever warrant
 and defend the above mentioned Land and premises
 with the appurtenances to be free and clear from all
