

In the name of God Amen I William Turner of West Handby in the Parish of Slaught and County of Darby doe make and institute this my last Will and Testament in plain and forme following

1st I give and bequeath unto my wife Grace Turner and to my three daughters Hannah Turner Ann Turner and Elizabeth Turner All the money that Belongeth unto me upon Bonds Bills notes &c to be Equally divided Among them four and then my Will is that my son William Turner shall have forty pound out of my wifes parte of the said money and this money is to be Call'd in by my wife and son William and paid to my said three daughters their equal shares of it as aforesaid But if there be any of it lost or that cannot be gott by my said wife and son William and my three daughters shall Bear equal parts of such loss

2^{dm} I give and bequeath unto my son John Turner and his Heirs and Assignes for ever All my freehold Lands lying in the parish of Norton and County of Darby Call'd by the Name of upper Stubbin and the lower Stubbin and now in the occupation of Mr Richard Bagshaw Esq^r with all the writings therein unto Belonging

All the Rest of my Goods Cattell and Chattells Except what is before herein Bequeath'd I give unto my wife Grace Turner and my son William Turner and do appoint them my sole wife Grace and my son William joint Executors of this my last Will and Testament, and do put them in trust and give them Custody of my daughters Ann and Elizabeth untill they come to age, and I do hereby Revoke and make void all other Wills by me made either in Writing or by word of mouth in witness whereof I have sett my hand and seals this Twentieth day of February 1726
