

This Indenture of bargain & sale, made & entered into this
 8 day of November 1792 between William Threlkeld & Rebecca his wife
 of Lincoln & Kentucky of the one part & William the same parish
 of York James Patrick James Murray James Cuthbert James Blair
 James Stewart James George James Walker James Long James Clark
 Matthew James one of Robert James Pitt's parties of the second
 part of chester County, Kentucky Witnesseth that the said William
 Threlkeld for and in consideration of the sum of six hundred
 Dollars to him in hand paid & in full payment to a contract made
 with Robert James and his heirs & by these presents does
 grant bargain sell & convey unto the parties of the second part here
 of said Robert James with & unto their heirs & assigns forever two
 tracts or parcels of land lying & being in a certain County on six
 more or less acres being the Tract on which said Threlkeld has
 partly situated one of his ^{own} parcels as follows to wit: Beginning at
 the NW & N corners of a place thereof 88 1/2 poles in length
 & running due West 1 1/2 poles with a course due to a white
 Oak & ash tree on the bank of Charles river thence N 65 E to 8
 poles to two white oak trees on the bank of Saw-river thence
 N 70 E 100 poles to the beginning containing exactly eight acres
 the other tract is bounded as follows to wit: Beginning at a white
 oak & black oak corner to James thence N 65 E with a course 110
 poles to his corner two white oak trees standing on the crest of a high
 river running thence up the river bounding on the several parcels
 thereof to the branch of Charles river bounding thence to the beginning
 containing barely five acres the heirs and assigns of the
 of land are also granted to the 2^d part of the second part & to
 their heirs and assigns forever to their only proper use & behoof
 and the said William Threlkeld his heirs and assigns do hereby
 covenant & agree to & with the parties of the second part
 their heirs & assigns that the said William Threlkeld well warrant and
 defend the title to the said tracts of land against all manner
 of claims whatsoever -
