 interested with Thomas Barrett who reside in Union County, Ohio,
 Charles St. Paul, who resides in the State of Indiana, Edward Lewis,
 who resides in the State of Kentucky, James Barrett, who resides in
 the State of Kentucky, John Barrett and William who are
 among other landholders in the State of Kentucky, who are
 members all of whom reside in Hamilton County, Ohio, to whom said
 copy of this order is herewith annexed. That they partition
 the land and the interest of Samuel Barrett, James Barrett and
 William Barrett and divide the same and hold firm their
 arrangements having been entered in this Court. That partition could
 not be made by the parties themselves on account of a title partition
 of the same described premises a certain case and the return made
 February 19th 1852. The Court upon a return in this way on a writ of
 specific partition returnable on the first day of next term should not
 be entered and such return is now and shall hereafter be a violation of the
 articles of this state to be given by publication in a newspaper in this
 County in three successive weeks. The first to be at least ten days before
 the day of hearing and a copy sent by mail to the nearest post office
 of their residing out of the County as far as it can be ascertained
 personal notice to them in the County ten days before the same.
