Since Morris named one of his sons Carnaby, I wonder if his wife was related to Anthony Carnaby, whose will was written 10 Oct 1699 in Sittenburn Parish, Richmond Co, VA. (need source).

Note: I received the following story from Lee Veal, and he received it from his Aunt Jean.

"The Fertile Branch" The following ancestral roots were furnished by The Rev. Canon David L. Veal

"Our primary American ancestor was Morris Veal who came to Virginia in 1680 from Gloucestershire, England. He settled on a substantial farm in Westmoreland Co, Washington Parish, Virginia. Our male ancestors who lived in Amherst, Virginia served in the Indian War and were participants in the American Revolution. An illustrious George Veal was elected to the Vestry of Trinity Parish in Portsmouth, Virginia in 1761 and a monument was erected in his honor 'To the Glory of Almighty God and in memory of George Veal' for his churchmanship and patriotism. Sometime after 1797 some of our ancestors won a luck draw in a land lottery and moved to Georgia, setting in several counties, including DeKalb and Bibb. Canon Veal obligingly searched his genealogy chart and knew we were a branch of the same family tree when he came across his Uncle Francis DeKalb from that county in Georgia.

Asa Lott Warren Veal (1842) obeyed the popular command, 'Go west, young man and seek your fortune' and left his family in Decatur (DeKalf County), Georgia as a young man [and] got as far west as central Texas. We know he married three times, fathered several children, Asa Edwin being the only offspring of his second wife, Cherokee Indian Nanna Slaughter. We are descendants of this fertile branch of the Veal Tree.

Please forgive and correct any errors. While a 'labor of love,' this has been a monumental task and I'm having my copy leather-bound for posterity."

Items from the Will of Morris Veal, Jr. 1750

Written April 09, 1750,

Item - I give and bequeth to my son Carnaby Vele the Plantation on which I now live and all the Land belonging thereunto unto him and heares of his body lawfully begoten and if he shold die without Heare then to my son William Vele and the Heares of his body lawfully begotten and if he should die without such Heares then to the Heare at Law.

Item - I give and bequeth to my son Carnaby Vele my neger Woman Pay and the Child she goeth with to the Gran daughter Elizabeth Carter and I also give to my son Carnaby one black Walnut table.

Item - I give and bequeth to my son William Vele all the rest of my land which I have in Prince William County except one hundred Acres to John Vele being at the lower end of the track nare to George Calbards and allso I give to my son William Vele one negro man called Gimbo and a negro boys called Harre and a negro garls caled Nan and the furst Child she brings to my grand child Elizabeth Hamton and if she should die the negro Child to be his one and I allso give to my son William Vele the Bad on which I ly and one Chast and halfe a duzen of Cheares and a oval table of Chare tree. I all so give my old Gun to Carnaby Vele the other to William Vele and fore wooden Chares to my son Carnaby Vele.

Item - I give and bequeth to my Granson John Tillet one Cow and Calfe.

Item - I leve for my sons Carnaby Vele and William Vele to pay to my daghter Sarah Pinson teen pounds current muney when ever she cometh.

Item - the Bad I leve to my son William Vele I give with all the furniture and badstid.

Item - I give and bequeth to my daughter Susanna Caret Carter my sorrell horse and one square table.

Item - I leve to my daughter Mulles Carter Adure (?) at Law George Tillet one Cow and Calfe.





The will was probated on June 25, 1750 (need source).
